Sometimes we forget that being "right" doesn't even matter when it means we are breaking relationships and causing pain. So for whatever we have done that has hurt you, I am sorry. Please forgive us. Please forgive me.

Roll call was taken with Gordon Johnson, Deb Book, Karen Bakken, Kaye Eiken, Jerry Hallum, Dave Larson, Chuck Pederson, Lyle Meldahl, Larry Topness, Jerry Evenson, Jennifer Nepstad, Carol Overland, Vicky Topness, John Rein and Michelle Rein present. Steve Howe was absent. A quorum was called.

Others present: Lisa Chiglo, Kyle Chiglo, Darryl and Michele Thompson, Pr. Dan Watland, Pr. Linda Gunderson, SE MN Synod

Devotions were given by Pr Linda Gunderson, SE MN Synod.

Agenda was reviewed and motion by Gordon and second by Vicky to approve the agenda. With addition of discussion with Pr Linda Gunderson added to the agenda. Motion passed.

In order to promote the wellbeing of both our parish and the needs of himself, Pr. Dan is willing to submit his resignation. It has been determined that Pr. Dan's last Sunday will be Dec 14, 2014. This decision has been made with the support of the synod. Pr. Dan will receive severance compensation to include 4 weeks of reimbursement as discussed and agreed upon by the parish council and the synod. Words of appreciation of Pr. Dan's service and support of Pr. Dan's decision were shared. Vicky Topness made motion to accept termination package, Sarah Bearbower seconds. Motions carried. Motion to accept Pr. Dan's letter resignation made Dave Larson, by second by Jerry Evenson. Motion carried.

Secretary's report was given and approved as read. Jerry Evenson made motion to approve, Steve Howe second. Motion carried.

President's report was given. As presidents of our congregations, both Larry and Gordon support the decision made by Pr. Dan to resign. Both presidents have been heavily involved with discussions with Pr Dan and the Synod. Pr. Dan's letter of resignation, as well as a letter from the joint parish council will be mailed to congregation members to share Pr. Dan's decision.

Pastors Report was given (please see attached notes of accomplishments). He continues to remain busy with duties and meeting. He has also expressed some concerns regarding some maintenance of the parsonage.

Chapter three of "Rich Church, Poor Church was discussed.

There was no correspondence.

Old Business/Committee Reports:

The fenced in area for the dogs has been completed. The basement insulation has been completed, much improvement in draft and pests have been noted.

New Business:

Salary for parish secretary will need to be addressed. This will be tabled until and updated job description can be completed. This will be done by Deb and Vicky and will be reviewed at the next joint parish council meeting.

Worship Schedule for 2015 has been presented, reviewed, and tentatively approved. This will be discussed with our congregations and will be readdressed at the next joint parish council meeting. It will be voted upon during the Annual meeting. There has been interest in increasing the number of joint worship services during the summer. There is also a proposed schedule for the vintage baseball league, and it has been proposed that outdoor services and luncheon be scheduled to coincide with the games at Highland Prairie.



The council meeting schedule was reviewed. Motion by Deb, David to accept council meeting schedule.


Next joint parish meeting to be held January 10, 2015 at Highland Prairie.

Old Business:

High Nitrates in the Water

High nitrates in the water continue to make drinking water an issue. We continue consider options available to address the issue. Jerry and Michelle will work together to formulate communication to the congregation prior to the Annual meeting.

A compliance agreement from MDH was sent to Larry with a request to submit a signed letter stating our plan to vote on water options at the Annual meeting and move forward with required actions. Motion made by Jennifer, second by Carol, to sign and return letter to MDH.

Church Repairs

Bell tower and eaves trough repairs are still necessary to prevent further water damage. The east wall near the organ also needs repair. This could be addressed when sealing of the steeple occurs. Jerry will again attempt to contact Dan Gingrich.

Aaron Topness is willing to repair the foor, he will address as time premits.

John and Michelle will talk to Andy Arends about the fire extinguishers that may need to be recharged.

Consider separation of "Building committee meeting" from "Council Meeting" to refocus on mission

New Business





The Holy Spirit is at work through our synod and denomination in fruitful, life-giving ways. Mission Interpreters also have the opportunity to keep the staff of the Office of the Bishop aware of exciting ministries happening at the local level.

Signs you would make a great Mission Interpreter:

You like to listen to stories.

You like to tell stories.

You enjoy making connections with others.

When you think about your church, you feel joyful!

When you think about our synod and ELCA, you feel excited!

You enjoy reading the weekly e-news Bright Spot.

It is our goal that all congregations have at least one Mission Interpreter and more than that will be a wonderful bonus! As a synod, we provide all the training and resources you'll need to serve as an effective Mission Interpreter. Our next training for all existing and prospective Mission Interpreters will be held on December 4 at Assisi Heights in Rochester. We invite pastors and lay leaders to attend. Please register at http://bitly.com/midec4. You can still serve as a Mission Interpreter, even if you are unable to attend.

The resources we provide for Mission Interpreters are also available for use by anyone in the synod. This means that even if your congregation does not have an identified Mission Interpreter, there are still many ways for you to uplift the ministries of our synod and denomination. The new set of resources we are launching as of December 1 includes our Mission Interpreter Calendar for 2015. Each month uplifts a unique ministry of our synod and denomination.
