Ponderings from the Parsonage...

In John 20: 19-29 we hear two stories. The first is when Jesus appears to the disciples in a locked room. He appears and gives them two blessings: peace and the Holy Spirit. The appearance is brief but left an impact on all the disciples, except Thomas who was not there. The disciples could not wait to tell Thomas about what he had missed. Who knows why Thomas was not there when Jesus appeared. Maybe he was the only disciple with enough guts to go out and pick up some food for supper. Maybe he just needed to spend some time alone. But we are told clearly that Thomas had missed all the excitement. When the rest of the disciples tell Thomas what he had missed, he chose to rain on their parade: "Unless I see the marks, touch the wounds, I will not believe." Talk about a downer. I bet his skepticism was a bummer for the disciples. How could they even tell others about Jesus being alive if one of their own refused to believe them? Did Thomas base his doubt solely on his own experience? Did he refuse

Did Thomas base his doubt solely on his own experience? Did he refuse to go along because it had never happened before? Was the possibility of something altogether new too much for Thomas?

I wonder what happened between Thomas and the other disciples? Did they get into an argument? We are not told. Did the other disciples begin to doubt too, in spite of what they had witnessed? Did the logic and past experience of Thomas get to them, or did they continue to believe?

The second story happens a full week later. Jesus showed up and turned doubting Thomas to confessing Thomas. A week of wonder, questions, and pondering. I wonder how Thomas and the others got along during that time. It is a powerful witness to their relationship that Thomas is still hanging out with the rest of the disciples when Jesus shows up again.

The reluctance of Thomas to believe causes Jesus to praise those who believe without seeing. What about you? Are you willing to risk believing even if it means giving up your well-founded doubts? Or will you stick to your own ways and refuse to believe in this new way, this new kingdom that Jesus is bringing?

The **Treasurer's Report** was given by Karen with a review of previous month and year to date income and expenses comparing actual and budgeted expenses, and a review of account balances. The **Pastor's Report** was given at the parish meeting.

Correspondence:

A motion by Jerry and a second by Deb was made to give her \$500. Motion passed. Committee Reports:

Jerry thanked Glen and Karen Bakken for the complete and accurate records they keep to assist with information requested, and Lisa for being accommodating when he misses deadlines.

A key has been issued to the Rushford Fire Department.

Four new designated outlets were installed in the kitchen. WELCA covered the expense.

Old Business:

Disability Solutions: An estimate of \$26,977 for a lift had been received. This does not include the estimated \$5000 of additional construction costs. Annual fees, service fees, permits, testing and inspection fees are also required. Another estimate is pending. There is a facility that is replacing a lift with an elevator so there may be a chance to make an offer on a slightly used one. This is not a budgeted expense and congregation approval would be required.

New Business:

Committee Vacancies: We will distribute sign-up sheets to encourage more involvement with our committees and projects.

Member email list: An email contact list for members would provide better communication opportunities. A notice will be placed in the newsletter.

Park Improvements needed: Entrance arch trellis, Rest house roof, Log cabin restoration

Bowl improvements needed: Repair building wall, Steps, Seating

Facility Use Fees for Funerals: The fees for funerals have changed for members. After a review and discussion it was decided to leave the fees as stated due to the utility and custodian expense when the church is used.

Usher schedule: Lisa has not been getting a list of scheduled ushers to include in the bulletins. Contacts will be made for someone to be responsible for the usher schedule.

Website: The website does not have accurate information. It should be updated on a regular basis.

Video Equipment: We would need a new projector in order to use the screen effectively.

Confirmation: Worship services on Wednesday evenings for students, parents, and mentors. All are welcome to attend.

President's Report

Council presidents Gordon and Larry along with Jerry E and Jerry H met recently for an evaluation and review of parsonage needs. The roofing project has been started.

There is enough LP purchased at the pre-paid price to get through the winter.

Pastor's Report

(Pastor Dan's report of accomplishments and plans is attached.) An ELCA handout "Establishing Safe Connections" was distributed. A video was shown with facts about social media use.

Old Business

Jennifer shared concerns about printing costs of the welcome/communication cards and color printing on the bulletins.

Deb shared concerns of some Highland Prairie members about the new worship times and complaints that the 8:30am service is too early. Elstad has a couple of families that are not able to make it at that time. We will wait until the service times change to see how many are affected at Highland Prairie.

Bowl service dates on the worship calendar are June 22 and July 22. Highland Prairie WELCA has them on their calendar as June 8 and July 13. We were unable to determine who scheduled the dates and will keep the dates on the worship calendar and let the WELCA officers know.

The parsonage roofing project is in progress. In addition to the previous deposit for roofing materials, a deposit for gutters and downspouts has been paid.

New Business

The bricks on the chimney for the main furnace in the parsonage are deteriorating and breaking. The roofers can do the chimney repair work which will include removing the chimney that is falling apart, placing a liner and replacing the chimney with a shiny pipe. The fireplace chimney is not damaged.

The parsonage energy audit has been done and we should get the report soon.

The parsonage committee will get an estimate to install smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors in the parsonage to comply with current mandates.

Plans for the 160^{th} anniversary celebration were discussed. The Highland Prairie worship committee has begun planning a "Celebration Our Heritage" themed event for the August 17^{th} Bowl Service. Representing Elstad WELCA, Ruth Abrahamson indicated Elstad would not be doing anything additional for the 160^{th} anniversary. The August 17^{th} service is a joint service and they would like to be included in plans for the service and meal.

No other business.
