#### Pastor's Page May 2017

#### For His Mercy Endures Forever

One of my favorite psalms is Psalm 136. It is a dialogic psalm in which the second line of each verse is the same: "For his mercy endures forever." In this expansive rendering of the salvation history of his chosen people, the God of loving-kindness is the God of wonders. He is the God of gods and Lord of lords. He is the Creator of the sun, moon, stars, and waters. He delivers his people from Egypt. He defeated kings---Sihon and Og---and gave their land as an inheritance. What mighty acts these are!

But the psalmist is not finished. God continues to remember and rescue his people. And finally how is it that this great God...our God...remembers his people? The psalm that begins with a "BANG!" of the aforementioned great acts seemingly ends with a whimper: "Who gives food to all creatures."

Yet is this act of giving food to all creatures so puny an act in comparison with all the other acts of his loving-kindness---creation, exodus, conquest? Or, has feeding his people and sustaining them...spreading a table where he prepares and gives food to *all creatures...* been his aim all along?

In the beginning God spoke creation into being for the nourishment and sustenance of his people. He freed them from their captivity in order to feed them in the wilderness. He gave them a land of abundance....a land flowing with milk and honey so that they might live. WOW!

Do you wish, at times, that you could have been at the dawn of creation? Do you sometimes wish you had been present among those who walked miraculously on dry ground through the sea whose waters were walled up on either side? If only.....

But do we not see god's wonders every day? What is the ordinary and everyday wonder of a daily table full of good things if it is not the revelation of the God of lovingkindness doing what he has been doing since creation, world without end?

This reminds me of a favorite hymn text that reads (prays and sings!).

Guide me ever, great Redeemer, pilgrim through this barren land. I am weak, but you are mighty; hold me with your pow'rful hand. Bread of heaven, bread of heaven, feed me now and everymore,

And so the God of loving-kindness does!!! We are recipients of the daily food that nourishes us at our tables. Furthermore, our tables are no less than an extension of the heavenly food of grace and mercy that we receive at another table....food that wells up to eternal life. And you know the Host at that table and the food which is received there. Jesus Christ!

So what are we to do in response to the great wonders he does every day? Well...The psalmist gives us the words with which to offer our full-throated response.

"Give thanks to the God of heaven, for his mercy endures for ever."

And I say, "Amen and Amen!" --plm+

#### **Eastertide Exhortation**

Christian soul, brought to life again out of the heaviness of death, redeemed and set free from wretched servitude by the blood of God, rouse yourself and remember that you are risen, realize that you have been redeemed and set free. Consider again the strength of your salvation where it is found. Meditate upon it, delight in the contemplation of it. Shake off your lethargy and set your mind to thinking over these things. Taste the goodness of your Redeemer, be on fire with love for your Savior. Chew the honeycomb of his words, suck their flavor which is sweeter than sap, swallow their wholesome sweetness. Chew by thinking, suck by understanding, swallow by loving and rejoicing. Be glad to chew, be thankful to suck, rejoice to swallow. What then is the strength and power of your salvation and where is it found? Christ has brought you back to life. He is the good Samaritan who healed you. He is the good friend who redeemed you and set you free by laying down his life for you. Christ did all this. So the strength of your salvation is the strength of Christ.

**Leading Together: What is it?**

The people of Juba, South Sudan will have access to health care because of your generosity! In 2016, the people of the Southeastern Minnesota Synod contributed nearly \$66,000 to the new Lutheran Center which is home to a community center, worship space, and clinic. This work was accomplished by financial gifts made through Leading Together, the synod fund that individuals and congregations give to in order to contribute directly to the developing of leaders, equipping of congregations, and accompanying of global partners.

The Southeastern Minnesota Synod is transforming lives in South Sudan, Colombia, Tanzania and right here in southeastern Minnesota. The ministry of the synod is accomplished through the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the generosity of our 174 congregations and 121,000 members.

There are two primary ways the ministry of the synod is funded: mission support (dollars from congregations) & Leading Together (dollars from either individuals or congregations). One way your congregation makes financial contributions to the synod is through something called mission support. The leadership of each congregation discerns together what dollar amount they feel called to share with the synod. These dollars are very impactful because together as the 4 million members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), we do so much more than we can do alone!

Congregations contribute their mission support dollars according to whatever schedule is most convenient for them: monthly, quarterly, or annually. Approximately 48% of the mission support dollars that come to the synod go directly to support the ministries funded through the churchwide expression of our denomination, the ELCA. These dollars support important work nationally and abroad! The portion of mission support that stays within the synod supports all the core aspects of our functioning including (but not limited to) call process, candidacy, rostered minister support, and faith formation.

Recognizing the need to build sustainable and expanding revenue streams in order to increase our impact, the leadership of the Southeastern Minnesota Synod felt compelled to explore new ways to empower individuals and congregations to give! Leading Together is the synod fund that individuals and congregations can give to in order to contribute directly to the developing of leaders, equipping of congregations, and accompanying of our global partners. 100% of these dollars go toward supporting specific initiatives identified by the synod. The people of the synod are generous! Leading Together provides another avenue for people to express that generosity.

In 2017, Leading Together dollars will be directed toward three main areas: (1) identifying 35 new candidates for ministry over the next three years, (2) equipping congregations including the launching of the Small Church Vitality Project to empower the synod's smaller congregations, and (3) supporting Rev. Wal Reat, ELCA Missionary to South Sudan. More details about this year's focus areas are available online at http://semnsynod.org/leadingtogether.
