Message from Pastor Marie

Lenten worship has always been an important time of worship for me. As a young child I remember it as a time to sing music unused the rest of the year, a time we could wear slacks to church and got to eat sandwiches after worship. (Lenten soup suppers had yet to be invented) When I had young children and before meals were served ahead of Lenten worship, the night was a rat-race. No one in my house was willing to eat and clean up in a hurry and everyone was tired before the worship began. And then Holden Evening Prayer and Soup Suppers entered my life. I thought, what more could you want in one night?

The food was helpful for a busy family, but the fellowship was the best part. Oh what a treat to sit and eat and talk with others. I ate soup and chatted with many of you last year and look forward to doing so for the remaining Wednesday nights this Lenten season.

Here are the guide lines I have developed and followed for over two decades of Lenten meals. Eat the soup that looks the least popular; it makes the cooks happy. (All the varieties served are tasty) Be careful when crumbling crackers to get as many of the crumbs in the bowl as possible; it makes clean up faster. Carry at least one soup bowl for someone else in need every week. Eat with different people each week; they will not know that you spilled food the week before. Eating with your children if they can serve and clean up for themselves is optional; a little time apart is a good thing. Introduce yourself to the people you eat with; when you introduce yourself, they will probably do the same and that's how you find out the name, you know you should know. You only have to introduce your family members if doing so is in your favor; you do not have to claim the person winning the contest to determine how many crackers fit in one teenager's mouth. Be at ease; everyone rushed to get here and is relaxing after a day's work. Remember: Hospitality is fun and Biblical; God reigns here not Martha Stewart.

A second quilting date will be on Tuesday, March 1st weather permitting. Set up time is 11 a.m., delicious pot luck lunch at 12 noon, working hands shortly after. Experience at quilting is not required as most everyone is a novice.

Coloring in coloring books is also welcome if anyone so desires that activity!!! No gifts or skills on any level are frowned upon.




