Pastor's Page, October 2017

I remember Grandpa Knudsvig. He came to live with us during his recovery from an airplane accident. He, my uncle, and cousin were passengers in a plane that crashed on a brutally cold day in December of 1968. My uncle and the pilot were killed. My grandpa and cousin survived but lay in the cold for hours. Both suffered broken bones and serious frostbite that necessitated amputation. My grandpa ended up losing both forearms. So when he came to our home, he was learning to use his prostheses. Or, hooks as we kids called them.

The outstanding memory I have of this man had to do with his patience and perseverance. I remember him attempting to eat his supper with his hooks. It takes a long time to eat your peas when they keep falling out of your spoon. But he was relentless. He kept on trying until all his peas were gone. I also remember him slowly and methodically loading, tamping, and lighting his pipe. When all was said and done, I think he really savored his smoke. Now, anytime I smell pipe smoke, I think of Grandpa Knudsvig. I won't elaborate on his description of using the bathroom, only to say, he made us laugh.

I cherish the memories of Grandpa Knudsvig. While as a kid I was amazed at what he could do without his arms and hands and how he managed with his hooks, it is his patience and perseverance and gentleness in what must have been unimaginably frustrating. To this day, I feel spiritually blessed to have had such a grandpa. He bore powerful witness to me and my family in such suffering. I wish he were still alive so that I could tell him how strengthening it was to observe faith expressed so powerfully, yet simply. And he was only trying to eat his peas, smoke his pipe, and any number of daily exercises we take for granted.

We live in this world and we do not know from day to day what we may be facing. The sudden twists and turns of a day are breathtaking and some may change our lives forever. But one thing is sure. God knows that suffering will come and death itself will come, but when it does we know that "we do not have a (God) who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses..(Hebrews 4.15). We do not have a God who does not know our suffering, not even our death. We have a God who is with us and for us; who is steadfast and patient, and helps us in our weakness. Grandpa Knudsvig bore the fruit of such steadfastness, patience, and love, even while undergoing tremendous suffering. Whoever thought that a man eating his peas, loading and lighting pipe, and so many other things, proclaimed the glory of God!

There's no doubt about that in my mind. And I am grateful.

Thank you Grandpa Knudsvig!

Elstad-Highland Prairie Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes

Sunday, Sept 10, 2017

The Meeting was held at Highland Prairie Lutheran Church with HP President Kyle Chiglo calling the meeting to order at 6:40 PM.

Roll call was taken with Jennifer Nepstad, Becky Lind, and Chris Hoiland absent. A Quorum was called.

Others present: Pastor Luther, and Tom Dybing and Robert Knutson are parish members present to address the council.

Devotions were given by Michelle.

Agenda was reviewed and approved with the additions of New Business item C) Discussion of Worship time. Motion to approve by Sarah, and Second by Dick. Motion passed.

President's report was given. No further updated from either congregation.

The Pastor's report was given.

- -Today was a wonderful day of worship and fellowship as an intergenerational community of believers. We were nourished and sustained as one in the body of Christ.
- -We met as a parish youth committee today. We have proposed a joint worship service in October to occur at Elstad with a Hayride and Tractor Parade following the service and a picnic lunch at HP. This will be addressed more under new business. We also discussed other ideas for future parish youth activities. The group will meet again in October. Feed My Staving Children is October 7 and there is interest in attending. Motion made by Tim to cover the cost of this event and second Jody. Motion carried.
- -Pastor Luther would like to incorporate a youth mission trip for the upper middle and high school children. He has worked with a group called YouthWorks in the past and has had excellent experiences.

There was no correspondence.

Old Business/Committee Reports:

- 1) Parsonage window update. Parsonage Committee met with contractors to get estimates for window repairs. Each estimate included a full walk through and thorough evaluation. 42 windows and 3 attic windows need to be replaced. Estimates from Larson's, The Board Store, and Ryan were obtained. Larson and The Board store use a vinyl window, and Ryan uses a composite window (more expensive but longer life duration). The committee presented what that budgeting may look like spreading cost over 5 years. Replacing the windows would improve energy efficiency and show savings in our current budget. Motion made by Gordon to move forward with presentation to congregations for vote to proceed with replacement of parsonage window, second by Dick. Motion carried. It is requested that formal quote is obtained prior to presentation to congregations. Notification of this vote will be placed in the October Newsletter. A special mailing will go to those who receive the newsletter electronically. Estimated cost of this project is \$34, 500 to \$37,500. Announcements to be made in worship October 1 and October 8, formal vote will occur on October 15. The Parsonage committee is willing to present information at the congregational votes. The Parsonage committee with communicate with Lisa regarding verbiage of notification mailings
- 2) Wednesday Service Evaluation. The attendance at Wednesday evening services throughout the summer has been sparse, ranging from 7 to 12 in attendance. Discussion about whether to continue Wednesday services occurred. Options would include discontinuing Wednesday services all together, continuing Wednesday services only in the summer months, continuing Wednesday services longer into the year (in addition to both Sunday morning services). We also discussed changing the format of Wednesday services to a more interactive and informal service. The summer worship schedule may have an impact on this discussion as well. There are many variables that need to be considered. 2018 schedule should be voted on in November. Motion made by Dick to have Sunday morning services at both congregations throughout 2018, including 4 joint services that occur at the HP Bowl. Second by Kay.
- 3) Copier from Tri-County. Tri-County is selling used copier, this is a good opportunity for our parish. Help will be needed to move the printer to the parish office. Gordon is waiting for final approval.
- 4) Gordon has shingles for the parsonage roof. Rubber roofing is not advised in this climate and rolled shingles are preferred.

New Business:

- A) 2018 Outdoor worship events. The vintage baseball schedule and Bowl service schedule is reviewed. We will also plan a joint Rally Sunday again, September 9, 2018. Outdoor services will coordinate with vintage baseball games.
- B) October 1, 2017 joint service. In an effort to increase youth activity and intergenerational fellowship, a proposal for a joint service at Elstad followed by a Hayride/Tractor Parade to Picnic lunch at HP has been proposed. This will be paired with a Bring your Tractor to Church Sunday. A joint Sunday school at Elstad has been proposed contingent upon HP board of education approval. Sarah made a motion to approve joint worship at Elstad on October 1, with joint Sunday school contingent upon HP board of Education. Second by Jody. Motion passed.
- C) A request to reconsider worship times has been brought to the parish council. The request to change church service back to 9:00 and 10:30, alternating every 4 months. The 8:30 service is difficult for members who need additional time in the morning to attend. It was desired that this issue be brought up before the annual meeting. Tim made a motion, second by Sarah, to pursue a congregational vote on Worship services times. Options include, 1) keep it the same (8:30 and 10:30 worship with 9:30 Sunday school) or 2)changing worship to 9:00 and 10:30, with Sunday school at 10:00 or 9:30 alternating based on service times). Notification of vote will be placed in the October Newsletter. A special mailing will go to those who receive the newsletter electronically. Announcements to be made in worship October 1 and October 8, formal vote will occur on October 15. Motion carried.
- D) Motion made to allow Pastor Luther to purchase an escape ladder for fire safety. Motion made by Gordon and second by Alan, Motion carried.

Secretary's report was given. Motion to approve by Sarah and second by Gordon. Motion to adjourn made by Jody, Second by Tim. Motion carried.

Congregational Vote \sim October 15th

The 'parsonage committee' met to evaluate window replacements in the parsonage. This project has been presented to and approved by the Highland Prairie/Elstad Parish Council to look for congregational approval. The Highland Prairie and Elstad Parish Council have approved a vote to be held by each congregation on **October 15th** to decide if this project shall go forward. The cost is projected to be between \$34,500 - \$37,500 to replace 45 windows in the parsonage.

We will also be voting on worship schedule times for the 2018 calendar year.

Interim Ministry: What is it?

Interim ministry is an important and special time in the life of a congregation. Interim ministry refers to the months between the end of one rostered minister's call and the beginning of the next leader's call. During this time, the congregation and its call committee enter into a period of discernment. They seek guidance from the Holy Spirit about the kind of ministry to which they are called as a family of faith.

The Office of the Bishop partners with congregations throughout rostered minister transitions from beginning to end. Synod staff members begin by accompanying a congregation through the process of interviewing and selecting an interim leader. Interims have special training to enter into congregations in transition.

Rev. Susan Miller serves as an Assistant to the Bishop for the Southeastern Minnesota Synod. She works closely with congregational call processes and the synod's interim rostered minsters. Miller shares, "Interim ministry is a specialized ministry. Most of our interims are trained in helping congregations to prepare themselves for a new chapter in their ministry...Interims are able to enter into situations quickly. They are called to love people and to provide space for people to consider their future."

The length of an interim varies by context. In general, interim minisry lasts less than a year. This is holy time.

One of the ways the synod supports its interim leaders and provides space for their continued leadership development is through the monthly interim gathering. Interim rostered ministers meet the third Thursday of every month at the synod office (Assisi Heights, 1001 14th St. NW, Rochester, MN) from 10:00AM-12:00PM. Miller says, "Monthly interim gatherings are a way that the Office of the Bishop gains insight into what is happening in the lives of congregations in transition." These monthly meetings are also a time for interim leaders to discuss ideas, challenges, and concerns. Rev. Dr. Paul Meierding serves as the groups convener. He reflects, "Our monthly meetings of interim pastors give us the opportunity to continue to learn and grow. It is especially rewarding to see the excitement of interim pastors as they learn from each other how to deal with challenging situations in their parish settings. I enjoy helping to choose topics to discuss in our monthly meetings that will help interim pastors become more skilled in this specialized ministry."

Rev. Marie Anderson is a trained interim who serves in the Southeastern Minnesota Synod. In reflecting about what she finds most energizing about interim work, Anderson shares, "An interim pastor is invited into the life of a congregation at a time when they are in the midst of so many different emotions and changes...it is an honor to travel through the time of transition with congregations and help them discern God's plan for their future mission and ministry."

Rev. Peter Soli also serves as a trained interim in the synod. He finds the experiencing enriching. "It is valuable and affirming for me to accompany and help guide [congregations] as they navigate through difficulties. I consider interim ministry to be a healing ministry where health, hope, and vitality to a congregation are restored and made new."

Bishop Steven Delzer served as an interim pastor at earlier points in his years of ministry. He is very grateful for the role of interim rostered ministers in our synod. He says, "I deeply appreciate the specialized gifts and skills that interim pastors bring to accompanying congregations through times of transition, reminding them of God's promise, "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope" (Jeremiah 29:11).
