Elstad Annual Meeting Minutes - January 19. 2014 10:00am

The Annual meeting was called to order by President Robert Knutson.

The agenda was approved by Philip Abrahamson, 2nd by Tom Dybing. The motion carries.

Pastor Dan read a devotion from John 16:13

Pastor's report was printed in the Annual Report

There was no Secretary's report, as Secretary Michelle Rein was absent.

The Treasurer's report was reviewed by Treasurer Jennifer Nepstad. Our giving has continued fairly steady, however, the fuel bill will be very high due to the extremely cold weather and high price of LP. The Shared expense will be higher due to a number of parsonage repairs.

Robert thanked all the volunteer that have helped in any way with all the church projects completed this year. There were too many to mention, but we could not have accomplished as much without all of their help.

Old Business:

The nitrated levels in the drinking water remain too high. The council is reviewing options to correct it. The water we have now is not suitable for drinking-especially for infants. John Rein was going to get an idea from Kingsley's Hardware in Harmony about a reverse osmosis system. In his absence, Tom Dybing made a motion to let the council decide about a reverse osmosis system, with a \$5000 spending limit. It will then be taken to a congregational vote. Larry Topness seconded the motion, the motion carried.

Dan Gingerich got the bid (\$19,050.00) to replace the singles on the parsonage, garage, and garden shed at Highland Prairie. They have received money for materials and will begin work when the weather allows. The eaves and down spouts need to be replaced to eliminate problems in the basement.

New Business:

Pastor Dan has requested more time between services to be more available to parishioners before and after worship. The council suggested changing the early worship to 8:30am, the late worship to 10:30am, and Sunday School will always be at 9:30am. After some discussion, Darlys Storhoff made a motion, second by Dick Haight. Motion carried. If Highland Prairie approves this proposal at their annual meeting, the change in worship times will start the first Sunday in February.

With 8:30am worship, a motion was made by Jerry Evenson, second by Steve Storhoff, to have Easter Sunrise service moved to 6:30 am (instead of 7 am) to allow time for the Easter breakfast between the two

services. Motion carried.

The Budget for 2014 was discussed. "The Lutheran" subscription cost was increased, as well as raises for the Pastor and staff, insurance, and pension. Fuel costs will also be higher. \$5000.00 will be set aside for steeple repairs and the water issue. Shared parsonage expenses will be higher again due to continued upkeep and maintenance. Merwood Storhoff suggested that we increase the amount given to the Synod to at least reflex inflation. A 3% increase would be \$300 so Merwood made a motion to increase the ELCA Synod donation to \$9300.00. Philip Abrahamson seconded the motion. The motion carried. Dick Haight made a motion to approve the budget as listed, second by Merwood. The motion carried.

Ruth Abrahamson spoke about "Great Changes in WELCA, supporting and caring for one another" on March 9. There will be potluck and entertainment. May need to switch service times with Highland

Prairie to make attendance possible.

August 25th will be the Music Festival with Rachel Storlie performing. Rachel Storlie is a Norwegian singer, born and raised in Spring Grove, MN. A silent auction will follow.

There was conversation about a bake sale during Rhubarb Festival in June. Recognition Sunday will be held in May to recognize the many special people here at Elstad. Elstad Election of Officers was held.

Other New Business:

The Cemetery fund was discussed. In order to continue to provide for care of the cemetery, a motion was made by Larry Topness, second by Merwood Storhoff to keep the cemetery fund interest in the cemetery fund.

Motion to adjourn made by Steve Storhoff, second by Dick Haight

Motion to **approve the agenda** by Jerry E, second by David. Motion passed.

Kyle Chiglo addressed the council about the confirmation schedule and curriculum, and questioned the expectations of the council and the role of the council regarding the confirmation program.

Pastor Marie Anderson, a prospective interim pastor, introduced herself and told us about her family, interests, past work experience, call to ministry, pastoral experience and the Intentional Interim Ministry training that has prepared her to assist congregations in determining their needs as she serves as an interim pastor. She answered questions from council members. Contract options were reviewed and she would be available to start February 18th.

Motion by Vicky, second by Chuck to amend the meeting agenda to include an additional item: Interim Pastor. Motion passed.

The **Secretary's Report** from the November 9th meeting was read. Motion by Sarah, second by Carol to approve as read. Motion passed.

President's Report

Larry has been communicating with the current supply pastor and prospective interim pastor.

Old Business

The proposed 2015 Worship Schedule was reviewed. Motion by Lyle, second by Jerry E to approve the schedule and present it for approval at the annual meetings. Motion passed.

The Parish Secretary job review was done by Deb and Vicky. Lisa will update the job description that is on file. Motion by Jerry, second by Deb to increase monthly salary from \$575 to \$600. **New Business**

The parsonage committee did a tour of the parsonage. Everything appeared clean. There are items in the basement and garage that will need to be cleaned out when there is room in the dumpster. Kaye has been approached by someone who has volunteered to help finish painting the interior walls. Smoke alarms and CO detectors have not been installed. There is a mirror ready to be hung. Door locks do not work. Door handles and locks should be replaced. Motion by Sarah, second by Vicky to purchase new locking door handles. Motion passed. Kyle volunteered to install the door handles and alarms/detectors.

The church copier needs service. Lisa will call to schedule it.

Council meeting time options were discussed. Motion by Vicky, second by David to keep the parish council meeting time at 7:00pm. Motion passed.

Interim pastor was discussed. Motion by Sarah, second by Vicky to move forward with the process to call Pastor Marie Anderson as an interim pastor and organize a committee to detail the terms of a contract with her. Motion passed.

The interim pastor contract committee will include four council members - two from Elstad and two from Highland Prairie. They will organize and arrange a meeting as soon as possible.

A meeting with the Interim Pastor, Lisa, Highland Prairie Worship Committee and Elstad representatives should also be arranged after the hiring process is completed to review the worship service order that will be used.

No further business.

Motion by Jerry, second by David to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 9:20 pm.

HIGHLAND PRAIRIE LUTHERAN CHURCH Council Meeting January 11, 2015

The meeting was called to order at 9:47am by Council Vice President Sarah Bearbower in the absence of President Gordon Johnson.

Roll Call

A **quorum** was called.

Devotions will be given at the parish meeting.

Several items were added and the **agenda** was approved.

No Pastor's Report

Secretary's Report was read with motion to approve by David, second by Jerry. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report was given by Karen with a review of December expenses including donations made from our remaining budgeted mission funds. A 2014 Income/Expense statement has been completed for review by the council to assist in preparing the 2015 budget. Motion to accept as reported by Lyle, second by Kaye. Motion passed. The report is available for review and subject to audit.

It was noted that our snowplowing service had not plowed prior to the Christmas Eve service and a member did the plowing to make the driveway and parking lot accessible that evening. Also noted was that Bowl Drive is still recorded as a township road, not a private driveway. This will be checked to see what is correct.

President's Report

A message was received by Karen from Gordon requesting that the documents he had emailed to council members regarding a prospective interim pastor be reviewed prior to the parish meeting.

Old Business/Committee ReportsJerry reported that a walk-through of the vacated parsonage has been done and noted there are some small projects in process that should be completed. Kaye has been approached by someone who would volunteer to finish painting the interior rooms. The door locks do not work properly. Regular checks should be made. The parsonage projects will be directed to the parsonage committee and discussed at the parish meeting.

Church: The door at the landing of the stairs has been replaced by a window that will be more energy efficient as well as an esthetic improvement providing a great view. **Grounds:** Tree removal has not been done but is expected to be done sometime this winter. We will be responsi-

ble for some of the cleanup.

Worship: The proposed 2015 worship schedule will be reviewed at the parish meeting. Vintage baseball games and possibly a car show will be coordinated with our outdoor services. A new Christmas tree and decorations were purchased by the Decorating Committee. Another key should be made to open the marquee sign because one was bent in an effort to open the cover when the frame was frozen shut.

New Business

A 2015 budget was prepared based on Karen's recommendations and anticipated income/expenses. Discussion was held about increasing our self-mission budget. A significant amount of our budgeted mission giving is through the Synod contribution. This will be addressed at the annual meeting during our budget review to get input from members to determine if the Synod contribution should change in order to have more funds available for other mission related donations.

A reminder will be given at the annual meeting and should be placed in the newsletter/bulletins that members can designate where their offering goes and Karen will place it in the appropriate fund.

The sanitation service will be contacted to change the pick-up schedule for the parsonage dumpster.

"Committee Review Ideas" was placed on the agenda by Gordon. This will be tabled in his absence.

HIGHLAND PRAIRIE COUNCIL CONTINUED...

Motion by Deb, second by Steve to provide camperships for our youth attending Good Earth Village/church camps this year and pay 75% of the early registration camp fees from the Magelssen fund designated for youth activities/programs. Motion passed.

Council terms will end for officers and two trustees after the annual meeting. A review of vacancies and those seeking re-election indicates there are still positions available.

Lisa will prepare a draft of the Annual Meeting Agenda for council review and will finalize it after she has received replies from all council members.

Annual reports are due and Lisa will contact those responsible for submitting the reports so she can prepare the booklet for the January 25th annual congregation meeting.

In order to accommodate schedules, 2015 council meeting times will be at 5:30pm on Sundays. Parish meeting times are at 7:00pm and our council meetings will take place before rather than after the parish meetings. We will ask the Elstad Council about their meeting times at the parish meeting.

We will get information about EFT, Bill Pay services for church contributions/offerings for our members. Karen said EFT would probably involve significant transaction fees and she will research the Bill Pay option.

The copy of the church constitution that was in the church office was borrowed and not returned.

An energy audit of the church should be scheduled.

No further business.
