Ponderings from the Parsonage...

For the first time this week I made a deposit of a check using a smart phone app. I simply entered my account information, selected the account and endorsed the check. And here is where the magic happens: I snapped a picture of the front and the back of the check as directed. Then I waited. And waited. And after about two minutes I got a confirmation message that my deposit was accepted. Which kind of freaked me out, because I was still holding the check. The check was deposited, but I was still holding the check.

That got me to thinking: our lives are made up of lots of deposits and withdrawals. Things happen that bring us life and happiness and energize our life. Then there are things that take those same things from us. This is not about comparing good and bad things, but more of a life balance thing. Both deposits and withdrawals are good things. But the reality is this: you can't take out more than you have put in. Many of us have been "borrowing" from our life account. Before long our bodies, our relationships and our habits take their toll. Something has to give. It doesn't take long before making more withdrawals than deposits catches up with us.

Where do we make these deposit/withdrawals? Here is the list I came up with: Physical, Emotional, Spiritual and Social. What does a deposit look like for these realms of life? They are NOT the same for everyone. I invite you to "snap a picture" of what a deposit looks like in these four areas of life for you.

Be aware that these four areas off life impact and affect each other. I may be making withdrawals from the spiritual or emotional area, but the deposits or withdrawals I make in the physical will affect what I can give in those other areas. If I expect to have spiritual resources, I need to pay attention to the deposits in the social/ physical and emotional areas. We don't live our lives in a vacuum: all areas of life need to be in balance for things to work effectively.

Another important point: not all deposits are things I "like" to do. This is big for me. I'd like to think that all deposits are fun and easy. While I am inspired by some of these life-giving things, some of them are not so fun. For example, I don't really "enjoy" exercise or eating right but they are important deposits for the physical area of my life!

I'm not suggesting that you need to do all the things you hate, but don't skip the stuff that is helpful. Not every deposit/withdrawal will make the list of your favorite things in life. There are probably ways to make those things more bearable, but they can't be ignored.

I invite you to picture what those life deposits look like for you. Explore what those deposits and withdrawals look like that help you to be the hands and feet of Christ. I don't have all the answers yet. I invite you to join me in our life journey together. I invite you to "snap a picture" of your own deposits and withdrawals. Is it a picture of the person God created you to be?


Rushford's Got Talent

The Bridge




The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has recently released a new Vacation Bible School Curriculum. This terrific resource is called Catch the Buzz.

Catch the Buzz can be downloaded and ordered free of charge through the ELCA (www.resources.elca.org/Products-ELCA_Malaria_Campaign.html).

The creation of "Catch the Buzz" stems from the ELCA Malaria Campaign, which was rolled out on a national level in 2011. The campaign enables our denomination to join with African companion churches in the global effort to prevent, treat and contain malaria by 2015. The goal is to raise \$15 million by 2015. Total gifts as of April 2014 exceed \$11 million.

Even if your congregation is unable to utilize the



curriculum for VBS this year, please consider using some of the skits, crafts, or educational resources in Sunday School or during worship. The tools provided can be used in a variety of ways to help build awareness and motivate action. "Catch the Buzz" resources can be adapted for use with older youth and even adults.

ELCA Malaria Campaign Coordinator, Jessica Nipp Hacker, shared her excitement about this new tool. Nipp Hacker said: "I'm excited that "Catch the Buzz" can equip children and youth to speak articulately about their faith and about how their Christian identity compels them to help others and to walk together with our sisters and brothers in Africa."
