Pastor's Page, August 2019

Several weeks ago, while driving on Dogwood Road past the Lawstuen homestead and gazing up the valley to the west, I saw a field dotted with bundles of oats. The beauty of that scene moved me to think about those wonderful hymns of the church that we sing in the fall of the year. While those hymns lend themselves to autumn harvest time and Thanksgiving Day, they point directly to the harvest of souls for the kingdom of God. Consider the hymn, *Sing to the Lord of Harvest*, #694, in our hymnal.

Sing to the Lord of harvest your songs of love and praise; with joyful hearts and voices your alleluias raise; by him the rolling seasons in fruitful order move; sing to the Lord of harvest a joyous song of love.

God makes the clouds drop fatness, the deserts bloom and spring, the hills leap up in gladness, the valleys laugh and sing.

God fills them with his fullness, all things with large increase, and crowns the years with goodness, with plenty and with peace.

Bring to this sacred altar the gifts his goodness gave, the golden sheaves of harvest, the souls Christ died to save. Your hearts lay down before him when at his feet you fall, and with your lives adore him who gave his life for all.

Sacred writ refers to the harvest in a number of places. More particularly, it refers to the place where the harvest occurs, the threshing floor. In 2^{nd} Samuel 24 and 2^{nd} Chronicles 3, we read about the threshing floor that David bought from Araunah, the Jebusite , upon which Solomon built the temple. In Matthew 3, we hear John the Baptist announcing the coming of the one who, on the threshing floor, will be carry out the harvest of a people saved and redeemed through Christ Jesus.

"His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

What might this all mean for you and me? May I suggest that our worship is like that. We are God's field. We are his planting. We are the grain of his harvest....grain made to be ground into flour. In worship we are subjected to the intense, cleansing heat of God's word...as by fire...and then baked into bread.

In worship, we hear the Word of God and eat the bread of God to become living bread, offered to God for his delight and to the world for its nourishment. Our corporate prayer in the Great Thanksgiving prior to the distribution of the bread and wine of Holy Communion bear this out.

Blessed are you, O God, maker of all things.

Through your goodness you have blessed us with these gifts:

ourselves, our time, and our possessions.

Use us, and what we have gathered, in feeding the world with your love,

through the one who gave himself for us, Jesus Christ,

our Savior and Lord. Amen.

And so on the threshing floor of worship, God speaks to us with the threshing rod of his Word, calls us to repentance, and gives us new life. He removes the chaff. And he feeds us with the Bread of Life, that in Christ, we might become bread for the world. And all for his sake.
