Pastor's Page

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

"As disciples of the Lord Jesus we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor...."

You may recall that these words were part of the exhortation you heard on Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. On the First Sunday in Lent, we heard the story the story of our Christ, Jesus, engaged in a the very same struggle, a struggle out of which he emerged victorious. His victory was accomplished for us. His victory is the source and summit which is our hope and stay---and because of which we may confidently continue the daily struggle of the Christian life, gladly engaging in its disciplines (repentance, fasting, prayer, and works of love), not only during the season of Lent, but throughout the duration of our earthly life in this world.

I invite you to ponder this hopeful assurance as it is articulated in this commentary on the psalms by Saint Augustine.

In Christ we suffered temptation, and in him we overcame the devil.

Hear, O God, my petition, listen to my prayer.

Who is speaking? An individual, it seems. See if it is an individual:

I cried to you from the ends of the earth while my heart was in anguish.

Now it is no longer one person; rather, it is one in the sense that Christ is one, and we are all his members. What single individual can cry from the ends of the earth? The one who cries from the earth is none other than the Son's inheritance. It was said to him:

Ask of me, and I shall give you the nations as your inheritance, and the ends of the earth as your possession.

This possession of Christ, this inheritance of Christ, this body of Christ, this one Church of Christ, this unity that we are, cries from the ends of the earth. What does it cry? What I said before:

Hear, O God, my petition, listen to my prayer; I cried out to you from the ends of the earth.

That is, I made my cry to you from the ends of the earth; that is, on all sides. Why did I make this cry?

While my heart was in anguish.

The speaker shows that he is present among the nations of the earth in a condition, not of exalted glory but of severe trial.

Our pilgrimage on earth cannot be exempt from trial. We progress by means of trial. No one know himself except through trial, or receives a crown except after victory, or strives except against an enemy or temptations.

The one who cries from the ends of the earth is in anguish, but is not left on his own. Christ chose to foreshadow us, who are his body, by means of his body, in which he has died, risen and ascended into heave, so that the members of his body may hope to follow where their master has gone before.

He made us one with him when he chose to be tempted by Satan. We have heard in the gospel (Mark 1.12-13, Matthew 4.1-11, Luke 4.1-13) how the Lord Jesus Christ was tempted by the devil in the wilderness. Certainly Christ was tempted by the devil. In Christ you were tempted, for Christ received his flesh from your nature, but by his own power gained salvation for you; he suffered death in your nature, but by his own power gained life for you; he suffered insults in your nature, but by his own power gained glory for you; therefore, he suffered temptation in your nature, but by his own power gained victory for you.

If in Christ we have been tempted, in him we overcome the devil. Do you think only Christ's temptation and fail to think of his victory? See yourself as tempted in him, and see yourself as victorious in him. He could have kept the devil to himself; but if he were not tempted he could not teach you how to triumph over temptation.

A mighty fortress is our God,
A sword and shield victorious;
He breaks the cruel oppressor's rod
And wins salvation glorious.
The old satanic foe
Has sworn to work us woe!
With craft and dreadful might
He arms himself to fight.
On earth he has no equal.

No strength of ours can match might!
We would be lost, rejected.

But now a champion comes to fight,
Whom God himself elected.
You ask who this may be?
The Lord of hosts is he!
Christ Jesus, mighty Lord,
God's only Son, adored,
He holds the field victorious.

Though hordes of devils fill the land
All threat'ning to devour us,
We tremble not, unmoved we stand;
They cannot overpow'r us.
Let this world's tyrant rage;
In battle we'll engage!
His might is doomed to fail;
God's judgment must prevail!
One little word subdues him.

God's Word forever shall abide,
No thanks to foes, who fear it;
For God himself fights by our side
With weapons of the Spirit.
Were they to take our house,
Goods, honor, child, or spouse,
Though life be wrenched away,
They cannot win the day.
The Kingdom's ours forever.

Highland Prairie Lutheran Church Council Meeting

February 14, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 5:37 p.m. by President Gordon Johnson.

Council Members present were; Joyce Dahl, Gordon Johnson, Tim Stensgard, Lyle Meldahl and Chris Hoiland.

Devotions were given by Pastor Luther.

There were no congregation members present.

The Council reviewed the treasurer's report, and will approve next month when Karen is available to answer any questions.

The President's Report: None

The Pastor's Report:

Pastor Luther thanked the congregation for the time off, it is appreciated. Today was the last sunday after epiphany, and Pastor Luther wanted to thank Martha for the music and Bobbi for the technical support. Lent begins this week with Ash Wednesday. Services will be at 5 PM at Elstad, and 7 PM at Highland-Prairie. The Highland-Prairie service will be taped. All midweek Lenten Services following Ash Wednesday will be at 7 PM. beginning with the service on 2/24/21 at Elstad. The theme for Lent this year is "Life together in Christian Community. Members are encourage to bring canned goods for the local food shelves. Online prayer services will continue on Tuesdays and Thursdays in Lent. A 5 week book study will begin this Thursday (2/18/21) on "A Large Catechism" by Robert Jensen. Confirmation instruction restarted in January with 14 great kids in class. There will not be classroom instruction during lent, as the students are expected to attent Lenten Services weekly, and work on their memorization work from the small catechism .Pastor Luther attended the Synod meeting this afternoon, where routine business occurred, including electing persons to positions, in the meeting it was discussed that the Synod is having the same issues as congregations today in regards to restrictions, and providing digital access. Pastor Luther indicated that Pastoral Care continues, and communion is available for shutins, but strict safety protocols will be observed. Due to continued access restrictions, hospital visits are still not possible. Pastor Luther also noted that the Synod has a "40" days 40 dollars" campaign that will benefit the global mission. He will post the information on facebook, and add it to the bulletin announcements for individuals whom would like to participate.

Committee Reports: The education committee will be reviewing the online curriculum that Elstad is using, and if they would like to move forward we will be buying the appropriate licenses for Highland-Prairie.
