Ponderings from the Parsonage

Consistent prayer is important to each congregation's mission. Are you open to a prayer invitation?

The first invitation is to pray for those who are close to you: your husband or wife, kids, brothers and sisters, parents, or others who are close to you. Jesus prayed for his disciples. They had spent years of ministry together and had become like a family. Jesus asked his Father to protect his disciples. Our prayers for those we love can be that simple: for God to bless, protect and encourage them.

Second, I invite you to pray for your congregation's mission. In our day-to-day world, it is easy to forget that we as the church have a God-given mission to accomplish. Jesus gave a mission to his disciples: to proclaim "eternal life," that they may know you, the one true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (John 17:3). What do you see as the specific mission of Highland Prairie and Elstad? Pray for that mission!

Third, I invite you to pray for your enemy, for the person that you struggle with daily or weekly. It might be someone at work, at home or in your neighborhood. In Matthew 5:44, Jesus told the disciples, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

A friend told me about his struggle to love his enemy. Every day as he went to work he saw a picture of the person and felt this bitterness rise up. It got to the point where he would take a different route to avoid the picture. He was telling his wife about this. She suggested that instead of avoiding it, he simply pray for God's blessing and joy to be with his enemy, to see that person covered in God's light. He listened to his wife and started praying. At first there was no change in the way he felt, but he continued to pray. Gradually he felt his bitterness go away. He began to see his enemy in a new light: as a fellow follower of God, made in his image. Are you willing to accept the invitation?

President's Report: None

Pastor's Report:

Accomplishments: Great feedback on the Holy Week Services and Easter. Prayer ministry is organized at Highland Prairie via email. Had a "thank you" lunch with the parish call committee. One baptism in April and two baptisms in May. 42 visits in April and May to nursing home and home-bound members, including 4 hospital visits. Attended Root River Pastor's meetings in Lewiston, rural Fountain and Mabel. Helped initiate a weekly pastor's text study in Rushford. The Winona text study has disbanded. Helped review the job description for parish secretary. Helped review the wedding policy for Highland Prairie. Completed the

confirmation classes for this school year in April. Led the Bible studies at Good Shepherd on May 1 and May 15. The parsonage now has a garage door. Thank you! On the task force for the Healthy Communities project for Rushford and Peterson. Kick-off event is June 1 at the high school gym. Gayle and I gave devotional Bibles to all the high school graduates who are members of the parish. Gayle has been giving tours of the grounds and doing lots of raking at Highland Prairie!

Plans: A forum to meet the bishop candidates is this Wednesday May 22 at Chatfield Lutheran at 7 pm. All are encouraged to attend. The 2013 Synod Assembly will be June 7-8 at the Mayo Civic Center in Rochester, MN. ELCA Bishop Mark Hansen will attend. A new SE MN Synod bishop will be elected. I preach June 9 at Good Shepherd in Rushford. A mission trip/Twins Game is planned for Thursday June 20. Work @ Global Health Ministries from 9-11 am, game at noon and home after the game. We may need to rent a van for the trip, depending on interest/availability. Bishop Harold Usgaard will preach at the Bowl Service at Highland Prairie on June 23, 2013. As of now we still need music for that day. I will be taking the following Kairos continuing education classes at Luther Seminary: "Welcoming Newcomers: How to Stop the Revolving Door," May 20-22. "Stewardship with Adults under 40" July 29 - 31, 2013 and "Narrative Lectionary 2013-2014" October 9-10, 2013. I plan to take vacation May 30- June 5, Aug 1-Aug 7 and Aug 27- September 1. This will include 3 Sundays. I am checking with local supply preachers for those Sundays. Plans continue for confirmation for next year. I plan to use a curriculum that will have minimal cost to the parish. Students are encouraged to adopt a service project as part of their confirmation requirements. Confirmation will take place on Reformation Sunday in October. There are weddings planned for Highland Prairie for September and December. Highland Prairie will host the Root River Pastors meetings on May 13, 2014.

Elstad Lutheran Church Council Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:40pm by President Robert Knutson.

Roll call was taken with all council members present.

A quorum was called.

The Agenda was approved by the council.

Congregational members wishing to address the council: none

The secretary's report from the March 10, 2013 was given. The minutes were approved by the council.

President's report: Elstad Lutheran Church was recognized by the SE MN Synod for our generous financial gifts in 2012. We are amongst the top rated churches in SE MN. A certificate of recognition will be posted on the church bulletin board.

Correspondence: none

Treasurer's report was given. While not at budget, we are in good standing and meeting immediate financial needs.

Committee Reports: none

Old Business:

- A) Church repairs continue. The council received an update on repairs made to the upstairs and basement, future repairs currently planned, and options for continued improvements/maintenance to prevent further water damage.
- B) Well water nitrate levels remain elevated despite attempts to flush the well. It is probable that a long term solution will need to be considered. It was felt that posting the well water in not for drinking and purchasing drinking water may be the most cost effective solution given the relatively small amount of water utilized for drinking. More discussion will follow as we hear more from MDH.
- C) Basement speakers have arrived and will be installed as repairs continue.

New Business:

- A) Voting on new member request. Kay Wold has expressed a desire to join our congregation. Motion was made by Carol Overland, second by Vicky Topness to accept her membership. Motion carried.
- B) Several long distance calls have been made from the church telephone. As this was seen as an unnecessary service, long distance has been removed from the church telephone line. The council approved this decision.
- C) Treasurer Jennifer Nepstad has received an option to pre-pay for propane used to heat the church. The council approved pre-payment.

- D) Marv and Carol Eggert have expressed interest in participating in an exit interview as they transition out of the role of parish secretary. Since Lisa Chiglo has already assumed this role fully and the job description was recently reviewed and updated, it was felt that an exit interview was not needed. The council approved the decision not to proceed with an exit interview at this time.
- E) Carol Overland, Ruth Abrahamson, and others have been working on plans for a musical fundraiser. Proceeds would go towards continued church repair expenses. It was proposed this fundraiser would take place at Elstad in place of the June HP Bowl service. HP council was addressed and will have further discussion.
- F) The basement repairs/updates have been nearly completed! The council would like to express our sincere THANK YOU to all of our members who have shared their time and gifts. Your efforts are a gift to us all and to our Heavenly Father. We are blessed to have such a wonderful church family.
- G) Pastor Dan has requested a subscription to Sunday and Service. This would allow copyright for LBW, allow us to print large-print bulletins, and print/project hymns. Motion was made by Michelle Rein, second by Jerry Evenson to approve this request. Motion carried.
- H) Pastor Dan has approached the councils to review his contract and consider updates to his salary and retirement contribution. Pastor Dan felt this was to be part of the 6 month review process agreed upon with his call to service at Elstad and Highland Prairie. Each council was to meet individually and discuss Pastor Dan's request. Discussion was had. The need to review past minutes to understand the review process was identified. Further discussion will continue at a later date.
- I) The council asked if there needed to be, or should be, more involvement with the Sunday school. Specific concerns included the timing of the Sunday school Christmas program. It was determined that flexibility in date selection needs to be maintained to ensure maximum participation, but date selection will also take into consideration the congregation's concerns and attempt to be closer to Christmas if possible.
- J) Storage continues to be a problem. There has been interest expressed in some unused items currently in storage. The council will consider options available to disperse unused items in an appropriate manner.
- K) The bi-fold door in the basement is broken. Its current location is proving difficulty with trim finish work. The council approved removing the bi-fold door and placing it in storage so it can be accessible if needed at a later time.



Resolved to Reimagine Confirmation

"Monkey business." That's what Martin Luther called confirmation in his day, as well as "fanciful deception" and "mumbo-jumbo." Despite his critique that it had no scriptural basis and it was being used to change the meaning of baptism, it is a time-honored, valued rite of passage in congregations of many denominations, including ours. Faith leaders in the Southeastern Minnesota Synod have been having conversations to explore finding ways to balance the tradition of confirmation, the opportunity for faith formation, and the cultural disconnect from the way confirmation programming is done in many communities. How might this be reimagined?

The Southeastern Minnesota Synod Children, Youth, and Family (CYF) Ministry Task Force has taken steps to broaden these conversations. In February 2013, they presented a resolution to the Synod Council to continue "innovative exploration" of confirmation ministry and to call on the wider Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) to join in the conversation.

Karen Gieseke, the synod's Children, Youth, and Family Ministry coordinator and advisor of the CYF Task Force, says, "Confirmation as a means to affirm Christian faith is a thread in the Lutheran tradition. It also is one of the most challenging areas of ministry in churches today." She seeks to find ways to connect content and experiences to challenge and build the faith of young people.

The resolution cites several national studies focused on youth and faith, studies that local congregations affirm in their own stories, that indicate that youth aren't connecting to and living out a Christian way of life, even after participating in confirmation.

After the resolution was adopted by the Synod Council, it was passed on to the ELCA Church Council. At their April meeting, they affirmed the importance of this conversation on confirmation and referred it to the Congregational and Synodical Mission Unit to extend this conversation and resource sharing with other Christian education networks, including those who teach Christian education at our seminaries and colleges. Resources reflecting these conversations about faith formation can be

expected in the next re-development of ELCA.org.

The conversation about confirmation ministry impacts the national church body as well as each individual and family in our congregations. People throughout this church, from parents to pastors, seminary professors to synod staff, ELCA Church Council members to congregational council members at our smallest congregations are collaborating to develop sustainable and transformative faith formation practices.
