Message from Pastor Marie...

June is one of my favorite months. School has come to an end and there are special events and vacations to look forward to. It also means Sunday School, Confirmation and other weekly church meeting groups are ending for the summer. It is summer vacation in many ways, but I hope that summer doesn't become a vacation from church or your spiritual growth this summer. Our spiritual health is dependent on the "flow" of the Spirit that we receive from God. That means taking time with God. It reminds me of a story attributed to the late Peter Marshall, former chaplain of the United States Senate.

There was once an old man who lived high above an Austrian village along the eastern slopes of the Alps. He had been hired by the village council many years ago to clear away the debris from the pools of water up in the mountain crevices that fed the lovely stream flowing through their village. With faithful, silent regularity, he patrolled the hills, removed the leaves and branches, and wiped away the silt that would otherwise choke and contaminate the fresh flow of water. By and by, the village became a popular attraction for visitors. Graceful swans floated along the crystal clear stream; picnickers gathered along its banks; and the view of the water from local shops and cafes was picturesque beyond description. Years passed. One evening the council met for its semiannual meeting. As they reviewed the budget, they noticed a small amount that was being paid to the "keeper of the spring." The village treasurer asked, "Who is this 'keeper of the spring'? Why do we keep him on the payroll year after year? No one ever sees him. Have any of you ever met this man? For all we know, he is simply taking our money and doing us no good whatsoever. In my opinion, this person is no longer necessary." Everyone agreed with the treasurer and the council voted unanimously to dismiss the old man. For several weeks, nothing much changed. The village went about with its business as usual. But by autumn, the trees began to shed their leaves. Small branches snapped off and fell into the pools that fed the stream, hindering the rushing flow of sparkling water. One afternoon, someone noticed a slight yellowish-brown tint in the water. A couple days later the water was much darker. Within another week or two, a slimy film covered sections of the water along the banks and a foul odor was soon detected. The swans left the village, as did the tourists. The economy of the village was in serious peril. Likewise was the health of the village, as many were getting sick from drinking the water. An emergency meeting of the village council was held. After much discussion, they realized their error in judgment and they hired back the old "keeper of the spring." And within a few weeks, the beautiful stream came back to life. The swans and visitors gradually returned, as did the vitality and well being of the little village in the Alps.

I think that our lives can be like this story. Our spiritual vitality is a product of the moments we take with God. When we are too busy to "tend the spring," our lives can be filled with backwater. Not only do our individual lives depend on "fresh water", but also the lives of our families and our whole community. The "spring water" that flows into each of our lives also flows out for the sake of the whole community. In Matthew 5:13-14, Jesus says, "you are the light of the world" and "you are the salt of the earth." I think Jesus would also smile at the thought that you are the "fresh spring water" of this world as well. Keep the spring flowing this summer. Take time for God to renew your spirit. See you in church!

2016 SYNOD ASSEMBLY SUMMARY By Rev. Emily Carson

The 2016 Southeastern Minnesota Synod Assembly took place on May 6-7 at the Mayo Civic Center in Rochester. Voting members from congregations across the synod came together for the two-day gathering. The event's theme this year was "We are Church Together for the Sake of the World."

FRIDAY, MAY 6 HIGHLIGHTS:

The Assembly began with worship led by Bishop Steve Delzer and Dianna Parks. Friday evening concluded with a time of prayer.

Peggy Hahn, Executive Director of LEAD, shared about what it means to be a remarkable congregation.

Churchwide representative Mikka McCracken highlighted the inspiring work being done throughout the ELCA.

Rev. Dr. Jim Martin-Schramm, Professor of Religion at Luther College, spoke about the intersections of faith and climate change.

Terrence Hassanally, Chair of the synod's Development Council, shared updates on Leading Together.

Dr. Allan Bieber presented a report on the churchwide initiative "Called Forward Together in Christ."

Rev. Dr. Eric Barreto led a Bible study highlighting the Gospel of Luke which included kitchen table conversation with Rev. Hannah Bergstrom de Leon and Bishop Delzer.

SATURDAY, MAY 6 HIGHLIGHTS:

Saturday morning worship was led by Rev. Tammy Dahlvang, Rev. Corrine Haulotte, and Kelly Bergman.

Saturday morning provided participants the opportunity to choose from eight engaging workshops.

Rev. Dr. Barreto's presented part two of the Bible study.

Organizational reports were given and awards presented.

Bishop Delzer's shared his annual Report to the Assembly highlighting the synod's mission statement and top three priorities.

Jeff Chestnut was elected as synod treasurer.

Elections took place for a variety of synod positions.

The 2017 synod budget was passed.

Five resolutions were passed at the Synod Assembly including:

Resolution 2016-1: Loving Our Muslim Neighbors as Ourselves

Resolution 2016-3: *Minimum Compensation and Benefits Guidelines*

Resolution 2016-4: *Thanksgiving for Military Person*nel, Veterans, and their Families

Resolution 2016-5: Dissolution of The Lutheran Campus Ministry of Minnesota

Resolution 2016-6: *Repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery*
