### **January Newsletter Article**

This year the gospel texts we will be hearing most Sundays will be out from the gospel of Matthew. Matthew's gospel begins and ends with scenes of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. In chapters 1 and 2, Mary and Joseph are his parents; in chapter 27, there is Joseph of Arimathea and Mary has "doubled" into Mary Magdalene and the "other Mary."

The first story is a story of life, the second, a story of death. The first tells about the miracle of the virgin conception, while the second tells of a burial. The first focuses on the child in the womb, the second one the crucified man in the tomb.

Yet, there are similarities amid the contrasts: The first scene tells of the coming of the Son of God. The second scene tells about his coming again...his rising from the tomb. The first presents him as the firstborn of Mary and Joseph. The second tells of him of him as the firstborn of the dead. The first is Jesus' birth story. The second is the story of his rebirth, and the new creation.

Yes, we are on our way in the great story of our redemption. Presently, we are reveling in the wonder of the incarnation of Christ (God taking on our flesh). The drama will climax in the astounding surprise of his resurrection at Easter (Christ's defeat of the last enemy, death). And if that isn't enough gospel freight, added to it is the promised coming of the Holy Spirit to disciples and the birth of the church and her life (i.e. Pentecost). And yes, it is a drama in which we find ourselves caught up in strange, mysterious, and powerful ways right here in the parish of Highland Prairie and Elstad.

So, now WE proceed in the unfolding of the drama of the Good News in our Christ. What will it mean for us? Where will it take us, and into the lives of whom? How will it come to flesh in us and in our lives?

Lord God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

This great prayer of the church offers the primary promise for us as forward we go.....together....in this new year. What could be greater and more emboldening? Onward, then! And what a blessing it is to be in the company of you, dear brothers and sisters! Middle-School and High School Youth!

It's time to meet and plan some youth events for 2017. You are encouraged to participate in a planning event for 2017 on Sunday, January 8<sup>th</sup>, 3 p.m., at Highland Prairie Church. We'll do some planning of events for the coming months and talk about possibilities for a summer mission trip. We'll play some games. And, of course, there will be treats.
