LWR does not send to any place in the U.S.A. or its territories. If we wish our items to go to someplace in the U.S.A. there are other organizations that distribute there. Per the 2020 LWR Quilt & Kit Ministry Guide: LWR no longer accepts bulk soap (only as part of kits), and no longer accepts fleece blankets. 2021 LWR will have a new tracking system.

### **Confirmation Instruction, 2020-2021**

Wednesday evening confirmation instruction for parish 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders will begin on Wednesday, September 16<sup>th</sup>, 6:30 p.m., at Highland Prairie. Class requirements will be discussed. A syllabus and schedule will be distributed to participants. Since all confirmation youth are required to serve as acolytes for Sunday worship, a brief lesson on the duties of an acolyte will be covered as well.

### Rally Sunday, September 27th

Sunday, September 27<sup>th</sup>, has been designated as the Rally Sunday....the day Sunday school will resume for youth of both congregations. Because of concerns related to Covid19, the joint Christian education committee decided it is best for each congregation to observe this new beginning in its own setting. Covid19 precautions will be observed (masking, physical distancing, hand sanitizer, and good hygiene practices, etc.) A suggestion was made that classes meet outdoors when outdoor conditions permit. Discussion was held regarding curriculum with the concern that there be material available weekly for any family that decides not to send their child(ren) to in-person Sunday school (for Covid19 reasons). Dear Friends in Christ,

At the July council meeting Pastor Luther asked what we missed due to the changes in worship. People said they miss singing. We know that Elstad's music festival will be very different this year and I suspect there won't be the annual Advent Cantata either. Those musical events have been part of Elstad's identity. Then Pastor Luther wanted us to think about what our identity is now or how we would like to be known. It's a worthy question for the people of Highland Prairie as well. It's not possible to hold those wonderful church dinners at this time, at least not with a packed fellowship hall.

I would like to propose that we as a parish become known for our generosity.

Recently I received an ELCA publication entitled Boundless, Stories of Christ's Abounding Love and Grace. There was one story that caught my eye. It comes from Bethlehem Lutheran Church in New Orleans. I worshipped there in 2007 while on a mission trip to help clean up after Hurricane Katrina. Bethlehem is in the inner city, a mainly African-American congregation. At that time they had made repairs to their building after the water damage it sustained and they were giving out appliances to people in need. Bethlehem was not a financially wealthy congregation, but they had a wealth of trust in God's abundance. The article stated that before the pandemic the people of Bethlehem were serving their neighbors a free hot lunch every Sunday. Now they are providing hot meals to go to 150 people three times a week. I continue to be humbled by their generosity and trust in God's providence.

A while ago one of our members, who has a generous heart, proposed that we help support the school lunch and milk program, so that no child would be left out. That need continues and I want to support it. Local food shelves continue to help meet the needs of people too, especially those who have lost their jobs, or whose income is not adequate. Our own ELCA and its World Hunger appeal helps to meet the food needs of people in the wider world. I believe these are all worthy causes.

So, I'm issuing a challenge. I will match the first \$500 given to local schools, food shelves, or the ELCA World Hunger appeal. You may make out a check to either Elstad or Highland Prairie and use the memo line to indicate where you wish your gift to go. Let us be known as generous people of God and share what we have with grateful hearts. I also invite you to pray for this effort, for a greater degree of trust in God's goodness, and for our willingness to share what we have.

- \* Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper (no loose leaf paper)
- Five ballpoint pens, black or blue ink only (no gel ink)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- One pencil sharpener
- One eraser, approximately 2- 1/2" long
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 30-centimeter ruler (or with centimeters on one side and inches on the other)
- \* One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

Imagine having to choose between a meal or purchasing a notebook. Project Promise School Kits are sent to places where even the few required school supplies may be more than a family can afford.
