Pastor's Page January 2022

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Some years ago while serving in Kenyon, I was blessed to be able to take a sabbatical from my pastoral responsibilities. I spent the better part of my time studying St. Cyril of Jerusalem's teachings for those who were preparing to become new members of the church. I was surprised and encouraged by the vigor and gravity of the preparation which included bible study, introduction to Christian teachings, Christian worship, and fervent prayer. The seriousness of the church's catechesis of new members was noteworthy.

For almost two weeks of sabbatical, however, Bobbi and I spent in Rome and the surrounding region, visiting countless historic churches and religious sites. We were in awe of the beauty and inspired by the reverence and piety of sisters and brothers we encountered. I remember that time with great gratitude.

A favorite day included a visit to the region of Umbria. There a man, St. Francis of Assisi, had roamed the hills preaching the word of God to merchants and beggars. As legend has it, he also preached to creation's creatures; birds and the various four-legged animals he encountered along his way. His was a life given to the pure praise of God, creator of heaven and earth. Hence, from his mouth came the song of praise otherwise known as the canticle of the sun:

Most High, all-powerful, good Lord, yours are the praises, the glory, the honor, and all blessing. To You alone, Most High, do they belong, no man is worthy to mention Your name.

Do you hear Francis asserting himself in the presence of God? Surely not. Rather he is heard giving God all the glory. And perhaps strange to our ears, he seems to relish the infinite distance between God and it all. Indeed, "it's not about him." "Praised be you!" he voices. And then again, "Praised be you!" It's as if his heart is ready to explode, so full is the joy initiated by the sheer excellence of God.

Teacher and churchman, Anthony Esolen, writes: "When we praise God, we surely render unto him what he does not need. But for precisely this above all do we praise him, that he does not and cannot need our praise. There is always something bravely extravagant about praise, something overbrimming, like a zucchini flower or a bird of paradise."

One may well ask, "Why did God create when surely he did not need to? Why did he create something and someone; other(s) than himself? He did so in love. That's why. He created beautiful things and beautiful people out of sheer love who reflect who He is. Esolen captures this truth. He writes: "And man who looks upon these things, man who alone among mortal creatures can see and love the playfulness and gratuitous beauty... gives God praise in return, a grateful heart for the grace of creation."

Brothers and sisters, we live to reflect the praise of God's glory. Even in these days of winter, such praise springs forth from the depth of our being as we share in the glory of his creative act and its fruit. And what is that but an expression of our gratitude. And born of such love, we are given to do nothing other than reflect it in words and deed to the praise of His glory. What wondrous love is this!!! Praise to the Lord, the almighty, the King of creation!

Happy and blessed new year in glorifying God be unto us all!

December 12, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by President Gordon Johnson.

A quorum was determined and a motion to approve the agenda as presented was made by Steve Howe, Chris Hoiland seconded. Motion carried.

Devotions were given by Pastor Luther.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Karen Bakken. Year to date information provided are income \$79,493.00 expenses \$82,450.00; expenses exceed income by \$2957.00. A motion to approve as presented was made by David Markegard, Steve Howe seconded. Motion carried.

Martin Luther on the Epiphany of Our Lord (January 6th)

Let us then observe how these Wise Men took no offense at the mean estate of the Babe and his parents, that we also may not be offended in the mean estate of our neighbor, but rather see Christ in him, since the Kingdom of Christ is to be found among the lowly and the despised in persecution, misery, and the holy cross. Those who seek Christ anywhere else find him not. The Wise Men discovered him not at Herod's court, not with the high priests, not in the great city of Jerusalem, but in Bethlehem, in the stable, with lowly folk, with Mary and Joseph. *In a word, they found him where one would have least expected*.

"They presented unto him gifts; gold, frankincense, and myrrh." Incense is a live confession, full of faith, by which we offer all that we have and are to God. The Wise Men traversed a long distance to bring this gift. Spiritually we can bring it swiftly and easily. The gift of gold is that we should confess Christ as King, laying aside our own esteem and the dictates of our reason and good intentions, that we should present ourselves as foolish, naked, and ready to be ruled. The sons of obedience are tractable, gladly accept their King, and bring all into submission to Christ. The incorrigibles who resist their King fall into tumult, anger, dissension, murmuring, and blasphemy. Thus we see that incense is faith and gold is hope, because faith believes that all things are and ought to be of God, and hope accepts and sustains what faith believes. The myrrh is love. Faith takes us from ourselves, that we should refer everything to God with praise and gratitude. Hope fills us with the concerns of others, that we may endure all in patience without resentment. Love reduces us to that nothing which we were in the beginning, so that we desire neither goods nor anything outside of God, but simply that we should commit ourselves truly to his good pleasure. This is the way of the cross by which we come most speedily into life.

We can present our gifts in the same way as the Lord says: "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me." He who gives of his goods to help the poor, to send children to school, to educate them in God's Word and other arts that we may have good ministers---he is giving to the Baby Jesus. He was not only born poor and needy but also, on account of Herod, had at once to flee the country. On the journey into Egypt the presents of the Wise Men must have come in very handy. So in our day we should not forget those who are suffering persecution.
