Ponderings from the Parsonage...

If you have been to any of the tourist destinations you have likely seen the "photo stand ins". You know the place where your face sticks through a hole in a picture so it appears you are part of the picture. So this got me wondering....

In John's Gospel, John the Baptist introduces two of his own disciples to Jesus.

The next day John was standing again with two of his disciples. When he saw Jesus walking along he said, "Look! The Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard what he said, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he asked, "What are you looking for?" They said, "Rabbi (which is translated Teacher), where are you staying?" He replied, "Come and see." So they went and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two disciples who heard what John said and followed Jesus was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. He first found his own brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Christ). He led him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon, son of John. You will be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter). (John 1:35-42 CEB)

Notice in this story that one of John's disciples was named Andrew. But the other disciple of John with Andrew remains unnamed.

Right after this story, Philip meets Jesus and then he finds his friend Nathaniel and brings him to Jesus. At the end of chapter one of John there are five disciples with Jesus: Andrew, Peter, Philip, Nathaniel, and the "unnamed disciple."

We can all venture a guess about who that disciple WAS. But today I would invite you to think about who that disciple IS. I invite you to consider that the unnamed disciple is YOU, the reader of the Gospel. Like Andrew, Jesus invites us to "come and see" throughout the Gospel of John. We are invited into a relationship with Jesus through reading the Gospel of John.

By the end of the John's Gospel, the author is addressing us directly.

Then Jesus did many other miraculous signs in his disciples' presence, signs that aren't recorded in this scroll. But these things are written so that you will believe that Jesus is the Christ, God's Son, and that believing, you will have life in his name. (John 20:30-31 CEB)

As you read the Gospels, I invite you to place yourself in the story. See yourself in the picture as the unnamed disciple. And participate in the life Jesus has to offer.

Hope, Healing and Food presented by Joyce Mtinda

Joyce is the Palliative Care Program Director for the Central Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran church is Tanzania.

This program was started in 2006 with 5 clients and a team of 3 caregivers. They had their first child enrolled that year in their AIDs treatment program. Now in 2014 they have 645 clients in 22 villages. Five hundred thirty of these are HIV positive, 63 have cancer and 52 others. Seventy three of these are children.

The office they work out of has no office equipment. The team meets here about every 3 months to get reports from the 44 volunteers in the 22 villages. The services they provide include home care and daycare.

Once a month the have a kid's day for the children that are orphans. The children meet each other, cook, play and do Bible study.

The churches in the villages are an important part of the program. They provide a space for the for the team to work. The team conducts public meetings in the churches to educate the people about HIV. The speakers may include villagers that have the HIV virus. They inform the people about the disease, the treatment available and how it works.

One of the challenges that the team faces is transportation. They have very few actual paved roads, so much of their travel is done by foot.

Tanzania is a very poor country. There is a lack of enough support for the Pallative care team to reach all who need it. The team does get some medications from the government. NELC provides some of the care medication and supervision. They get support from the United States. The Vermont Hospital FHSSA is a major contributor. Our Saviors Lutheran Church in Rochester is also a major contributor. Over 40% of the health care is delivered by the Lutheran and the Catholic religious organizations.

Morphine is the main drug used for pain management for cancer patients and is not that expensive. It's about \$7 for a 5 liter bottle that has a shelf life of 3 months. However, transportation to get it is expensive. There is a 5 day journey to pick it up. They use holistic medicine along with the morphine. One of the things they do is to sing soothing songs to comfort the clients and family.

In Tanzania there are 50,000 cancer patients without medication to treat their pain. There are 150,000 AIDs patients without medication for pain, both physical and spiritually.

The workshop was very informative and Joyce closed the workshop with one of her favorite folk songs that she frequently sings with her clients.

Elstad Lutheran Church Council Meeting

Sunday, March 9, 2014

The Meeting was held at Highland Prairie Lutheran Church with President Larry Topness calling the meeting to order following the Joint Council Meeting with Highland Prairie.

- Roll call was taken with Larry Topness, Jerry Evenson, Michelle Rein, Jennifer Nepstad, Carol Overland and Vicky Topness present. John Rein was absent. A quorum was called.
- Ruth Abrahamson, WELCA president, was present to address the council regarding plans for the parish's 160t h Anniversary celebration being planned with Highland Prairie.
- Secretary's report was given and approved.
- Treasure's report was given and approved. We are still short funds given the high LP costs this winter.
- President's report was given. Energy Audit was performed February 1, 2014.
- There was no correspondence.
- There were no committee reports.

Old Business:

High nitrates in the water continue to make drinking water an issue. We will continue to work with the state requirements to resolve this issue. It is anticipated that appropriated treatment options will be expensive. Working with water treatment systems seems to be the best option at this time. We will continue to pursue available options.

Sealing the church steeple also needs to be addressed to prevent further water damage to the church. Due to access and safety, this will be readdressed in the Spring.

New Business:

The Parish 160th Anniversary Celebration is currently being planned as a joint celebration held at the Highland Prairie grounds. The celebration will likely include a Bowl Service in August, with a "Heritage Wall" in the Highland Prairie church basement for everyone to enjoy. Invitations or previous parish pastors will be sent, and a lunch will be planned. Elstad WELCA will offer assistance to the Highland Prairie Planning Committee.

There are areas of cracking tile in the kitchen that need to be repaired. We will check with Tom Dybing to see if any extra tiles remain to be used for repairs.

There are currently no reserved parking areas for Pastor Dan or reserved handicapped parking areas. Previously, there were signs posted to reserve parking areas for this purpose. We will check with Tom Dybing to see if these signs can be replaced.

The council had been approached regarding the possibility of purchasing round tables for the church basement. It was felt round tables may better facilitated conversation during dining. After discussion, it was felt that the church recently purchased new rectangular tables, and additional tables were not necessary at this time, especially given our current financial strain. In addition, storing round tables may be more difficult, as they would not fit in the current storage area under the front steps.

There has been black mold noticed near the basement swinging doors. This problem should be resolved with sealing of the steeple. In the mean time, this needs to be cleaned aggressively with bleach to reduced risk of inhalation and health issues. We will talk to Carolyn Freese about cleaning this area.

We were addressed by the Highland Prairie council to consider support of a Rushford native, Carina Schiltz, as she pursues her studies at Trinity Fellowship ELCA to become a pastor. We would be happy to offer her opportunities to preach when a substitute pasor is needed in Pastor Dan's absence.

Elstad-Highland Prairie Lutheran Church Council Meeting Sunday, May 18, 2014

The Meeting was held at Elstad Lutheran Church with Elstad President Larry Topness calling the meeting to order at 7:02pm.

Roll call was taken with John Rein, Sarah Bearbower, and Chuck Pederson absent. A quorum was called.

Devotions were given by Jerry Hallum.

Agenda was reviewed and motion by Gordon and second by Carol to approve the agenda.

Secretary's report was given and approved as read.

President's report was given. The recent SE MN Synod meeting was attended by Lyle, Larry, and Pastor Dan. The program focused on "G-Local", a synod program working on eliminating hunger locally and worldwide. In addition, "Resolution 2014-01: Minimum Compensation and Benefits Guidelines" was reviewed. A copy of this document was shared with the council.

Pastors Report was given (please see attached notes of accomplishments). Monday June 30 is ELCA day at Valley Fair. The confirmation class is considering a group outing.

There was no correspondence.

There were no committee reports.

Old Business:

Energy audit for the parsonage was reviewed. Recommendations included replacing weather stripping of doors and adding attic insulation to reduce energy cost. Cost savings would be seen in around 10 years. There were also recommendations to improve basement insulation, with significant additional cost. Motion was made by Gordon to proceed with weather stripping and attic insulation, but wait to do basement insulation at a later date. Motion was seconded by Vicky and carried. .

Parsonage repairs continue. The new roof looks great. No water leakage was seen after the recent heavy rains. There are cracks in the external stucco that may need to be repaired using latex caulk in cracks and seams. There are several windows that will need to be addressed. The parsonage committee will continue to review needs and priorities.

Up to date CO monitors and fire detectors need to be placed in the parsonage near the bedrooms. The parsonage committee will pursue this.

Water drainage between parsonage and garage continues to be a problem. Drain tile to direct water flow away from the garage may need to be placed. This will also be addressed by parsonage committee.

New Business:

Schedule for special services was reviewed. Historically we have rotated Holy week services (Lent, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday) between Elstad and Highland Prairie. Pastor Da suggested we could consider keeping services designated at a specific site. This would encourage traditions and predictability for services, especially for any community members wishing to attend. Pastor referenced Elstad's Cantata as an example of a successful tradition. We will table this for now and consider this again prior to the annual meeting.

Attendance for Joint Services. How can we facilitate or encourage a feeling of "oneness" between our parishes. Confirmation students have participated in Lenten services at each parish. In the past, joint youth groups have helped combine the parishes. Ideas and suggestions are appreciated.

Nitrates at HP and parsonage are OK. Keep records for 10 years,

160th Anniversary Celebration. Highland Prairie worship committee is leading the planning. Ruth Abrahamson, Elstad WELCA President, is the Elstad contact. As the Highland Prairie worship committee moved ahead, they will contact Ruth to coordinate further plans.

June 22 and July 20 are the set bowl dates. The July 20th date conflicts with Rushford's community celebration. A request was made to move the July bowl service date from July 20th to July 13th. Motion was made by Deb to move the July bowl service date to July 13th, second by David. Motion carried.

Motion to adjourn made by Jerry E, second by Lyle. Meeting was adjourned at 8pm.

The Waste Management contract termination notice will be submitted by Karen in June.

Historian assistance with genealogy records is needed.

Marketing our church as historic was discussed to attract new members and visitors. Pastors that met recently at Highland Prairie expressed interest in having activities here. It is imperative that the website is updated regularly to have current information for anyone interested in our church.

Light bulbs for our ceiling fixtures have been donated by Norm's Electric.

Worship:

We will not place an ad in the Visitor's Guide or pursue any marketing of our church until we have someone responsible for keeping the website information current.

Our grand daughter will be baptized at Elstad on Father's Day.



Special Edition: Synod Assembly 2014



The 2014 Southeastern Minnesota Synod Assembly was held on May 2-3 at the Mayo Civic Center. The event's theme was "We Are Called." A special highlight this year was the leadership of the Glocal Formation Team. Glocal is a combination of the words global and local. The mission of the Glocal Formation Team is to encourage God's people to love and serve on both a global and local level.

The Glocal Formation Team is comprised of staff members from the churchwide offices of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and musicians from around the country. On both Friday and Saturday, the team shared music from around the world. The gathered assembly, made up of more than 600 registrants, sang and danced to the sounds of maracas, bongos, and guitar.

The event's schedule included worship, Bible study, fellowship, workshops, and shared meals.

Rev. Rafael Malpica Padilla, who serves as Executive Director for the ELCA Division for Global Mission, presented three Bible studies and one presentation over the course of the weekend. Drawing from the book of Genesis, Rev. Malpica Padilla emphasized the importance of communication and connection in our shared life of faith. He shared, "The essence of God is relationships."

On Saturday, Rev. Malpica Padilla presented a report and video on behalf of Elizabeth Eaton, the Presiding Bishop of the ELCA.

Two large group presentations were facilitated by Rev. Sunitha Mortha, Director of Mission Formation for the ELCA. Rev. Mortha focused on themes of accompaniment, culture, and hunger to encourage those gathered to think about mission and community in new ways.

Rev. Nick Fisher-Broin and Rev. Beth Krolack presented a video highlighting the trip that youth from around the synod took to Tanzania in 2013.

Bishop Steven Delzer shared a sermon during worship on Friday. He presented his report on Saturday afternoon. Bishop Delzer rooted both of his messages around the synod's six-year initiative "Enough Food for All." The goal of the initiative is to end food insecurity in southeastern Minnesota by 2020.

Two videos highlighting food-based ministries happening in the synod were presented. The videos were created by Rev. Paige Whitney, Rev. Jonathan Davis, Rev. Lindsay Stolen, and Rev. Charlie Leonard.

Saturday morning centered around eight different workshops for synod participants to choose from. The workshops, focused on issues of advocacy, food, and justice, were facilitated by leaders from a variety of organizations.

Rev. Emmanuel Kaghonda and Joyce Mtinda were special guests at the assembly, both from Tanzania. Rev. Emmanuel preached during Saturday's worship service, and he also wrote a special musical composition for the assembly called "Tunaomba Huruma" which means "we ask for your mercy."

Joyce Mtinda serves as the Palliative Care Program Director for the Central Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania. In addition to sharing a greeting with the full assembly, Mtinda also facilitated one of the workshops on Saturday morning.

There were opportunities over the course of the weekend to lift up congregations and individuals for their ministries in the synod. Time was set apart for the recognition of those celebrating ordination anniversaries and those who have retired. Affirmation was also expressed to outgoing council members and synod staff members. Special awards were presented by Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota and the synod's Hunger Task Force. The Endowment Committee presented debt retirement awards as well.

During the Assembly, individuals were elected to participate on a number of boards and tables throughout the synod. No new nominations were received from the floor, so a vote via ballot was not required.

One resolution was discussed and approved. The approval of Resolution 2014-01 confirms the minimum compensation guidelines for 2015 which apply to Pastors, Associates in Ministry, Deaconesses, Diaconal Ministers, and lay professionals in the synod.

The Synod Secretary, Jodie Archer, shared a report. Her report uplifted a variety of bylaw amendments required by the 2013 Churchwide Assembly.

The Synod Treasurer, John Petersburg, shared a report during the assembly. The 2015 budget was passed at a dollar amount of \$2,002,600. Petersburg also shared reflections on the positive progress that has been made on the audit which is being facilitated by Hawkins Ash CPAs of Rochester, Minnesota.

As the assembly drew to a close, Bishop Delzer laid out a six-year vision for the synod. The vision highlights "Enough Food for All" as one of the many ways congregations can re-root in their communities. Bishop Delzer encouraged all those in attendance to read "The Mission Table" by Rev. Stephen Bouman. This book inspired much of Bishop Delzer's hopes for the Southeastern Minnesota Synod. An intentional focus on deep listening and community engagement will play a pivotal role in serving as the Body of Christ in this region.

The people of God are at work in powerful ways throughout the Southeastern Minnesota Synod. This year's assembly served as a meaningful, enriching time to engage on a local and global level with the activity of the Holy Spirit.
