Message from Pastor Marie December 2015

Most Christian families will put up some kind of nativity scene as part of their Christmas decorations. It may be generations old, small child friendly or outside covered with snow. It may have dozens of pieces or only one. I have one with four dozen sheep, so I can be sure to have one for each child during the Children's Sermon. For some reason, I have become the owner of a few dozen nativity scenes, each unique in its own way. Most are gifts and all have a story. Perhaps I'll be able to find room for a few in my office this Advent and Christmas season.

The family nativity goes up when the Christmas tree does; maybe it even sits under the tree, and goes back in the box when the decorations are put away, except when it stays up all year. I encourage you to keep your nativity out, or at least a few pieces of it, all year. Why leave up a nativity all year? There are practical reasons and aesthetic reasons aplenty, but the best reason of all is a nativity scene in July gives you an opportunity to witness to your faith. It works like this.

- * A visitor notices the nativity scene and lets you know your forgot to put it away.
- * This gives you the perfect opening to share your faith as you tell the visitor that you leave it up intentionally.
- * Saying something like; in this home we want to be reminded that God's love is year around. Jesus, God's love for us in human skin, came at Christmas and changed every day thereafter.

Yes, there has been at least one nativity in my office since I moved in last February. I look forward to hearing from you about your year-around nativities and how they have helped you to witness to your year-around faith. I also invite you to stop by my office and look at some of my nativities; especially this Advent and Christmas.

May your Advent waiting and Christmas celebrating be filled with opportunities to share your faith.

Business Items:

- K) Transition task force update. We will be looking for volunteers for the call committee.

Full minutes will be made available for review upon request after formal approval by the Elstad council.



The Holy Spirit is at work through our synod and denomination in fruitful, life-giving ways. As the staff of the Office of the Bishop, we strive to empower all congregations to feel



connected to the work of our synod and denomination. We are all on the same team working toward the same goals, and we can do far more together than we can on our own. All three expressions of our church – congregational, synodical, and denominational – are important ways we live out our shared calling to be the hands and feet of Jesus.

One of the ways we link southeastern Minnesota congregations to the work of our synodical and denominational ministries is through the work of Mission Interpreters. These are lay, volunteer leaders from each congregation around the synod with an integral role in building a sense of connectedness and unity. Their primary task is to express the love of Christ by sharing stories. Mission Interpreters empower congregational members to feel connected to God's activity in and outside the walls of the sanctuary. Mission Interpreters also have the opportunity to keep the staff of the Office of the Bishop aware of exciting ministries happening at the local level.

Signs you would make a great Mission Interpreter:

You like to listen to stories.

You like to tell stories.

You enjoy making connections with others.

When you think about your church, you feel joyful!

When you think about our synod and ELCA, you feel excited!

You enjoy reading the weekly e-news Bright Spot.

It is our goal that all congregations have at least one Mission Interpreter and more than that will be a wonderful bonus! As a synod, we provide all the training and resources you'll need to serve as an effective Mission Interpreter. Our next training for all existing and prospective Mission Interpreters will be held on December 4 at Assisi Heights in Rochester. We invite pastors and lay leaders to attend. Please register at http://bitly.com/midec4. You can still serve as a Mission Interpreter, even if you are unable to attend.

The resources we provide for Mission Interpreters are also available for use by anyone in the synod. This means that even if your congregation does not have an identified Mission Interpreter, there are still many ways for you to uplift the ministries of our synod and denomination. The new set of resources we are launching as of December 1 includes our Mission Interpreter Calendar for 2015. Each month uplifts a unique ministry of our synod and denomination. Related links to those ministries will also be provided including a related issue of *The Bridge*. The goal of this calendar is to make it as easy as possible to continue building a sense of connectedness between all three expressions of the ELCA
