Ponderings from the Parsonage:

God is There: Just Look

I've been in a lot of peoples' homes recently. It is easy for me to get caught up in sermon writing and planning for worship. There is always more to do, more to plan, more to organize, more emails to send. Much of the "Sunday" work feels like it can't wait, so other things get pushed aside. Last week, I had the opportunity to make many, many pastoral visits. (Thanks to Bishop Usgaard preaching, I had no sermon to prepare.)

And what did I see? I saw God. You come to expect to meet God at church. So much work, so much planning goes into each and every service. And when it is the bowl service or a baptism or a funeral, (all 3 happened last week) you expect God to show up. And God does.

But the homes I visit are holy places, too. For all the time I spend in at church, one assumes I often feel God's presence there, and I do, especially in worship. Yet sometimes I overlook how God is present everywhere—in our homes, at work, in our everyday life and in our hearts. I became a witness this past week to God's presence in the lives of those around me, and what a privilege it has been. We often talk about what God can do, but do we really, truly believe it? And do we believe not only in what God can do, but in what God is doing, in the ordinariness of our lives?

I can tell you what I've seen.

I saw God in the tears of a man recently diagnosed with dementia.

I saw God in the contentment of someone who recently went on hospice.

I saw God in the way an elderly woman graciously accepted a prayer shawl even though she is retreating into dementia.

I saw God in a man who has not been in church for years. He sat across his kitchen table from me, and told me how grateful he was for this church.

I saw God in the face of the baby I held, and in the way his parents looked at him with pride. This baby was so quiet through my prayer and blessing over him, and I saw God in his gentle spirit too.

I saw God in the hospitality of the family who welcomed me into their home for a visit about becoming part of our church, and in the fellowship and pie we shared.

I saw God when I visited a proud grandma who delighted in sharing the pictures of a recent family wedding.

At nearly every visit, we shared communion together, and God formed us into a community of grace, mercy and joy.

After I absorbed all these God experiences, I began to ask myself, what about my own home? It can be easy to see God in the lives of others, but it's often hard to see God in my own home. I get distracted by the flaws and what needs to be done next to prepare a home for sale.

Is God really present in my interactions with my family, in our struggles to manage three homes? Oh yes. And God is in the midst of the storm damage. God is in the midst of the days we let the garage stay cluttered while we walk the dogs. God is in the moments of laughter as we watch reruns of "The Big Bang Theory."

God is an awesome God who is there in the midst of our everyday life. May God let us really see through eyes of faith, what God is doing, right in front of us.

So here's my invitation for this month: Take your day-to-day life, your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, everyday life and look for God there.
