Pastor's Page June 2017

When I was a boy, my father hung a wren house on the wall of the summer kitchen. From my open bedroom window, I received an early morning wake-up call from a wren that made the house it's summer home. It came even before the wake-up call I received from my father. That's another story for another time.

Now that I am living in the country, and the season of sleeping with an open window is upon us, I once again awaken to the sweet and cheery voice of the wren and any number of other song birds. It's glorious!

Why do birds sing at the break of day? Why does the lilac, like the one in the backyard of my childhood home, or the one in the yard of the parsonage, cast its fragrance out on the air? Why do fields and forests appear as verdant velvet as I gaze upon the creation these days?

Hearing, smell, and sight are all senses that receive their pleasures at a distance. And for whom are these pleasures? And why?

I remember my dear father's answer to the question. "These pleasures are for us. And the reason why we have the gift of such pleasures resides in "God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth."

Creation's sounds, fragrances and sights draw us from a distance, inviting us to behold, listen, taste, and touch. Christian teacher, Peter Leithart, writes that "they are not only for us. For the Christian, the ultimate answer (to the questions: For whom? And why?) is liturgical."

The third verse of the opening hymn of Holy Communion on May 21st, "O That I had a Thousand Voices," make the point. Its words and melody humanly article the cosmic liturgy of all creation. And so we sang:

"You forest leaves so green and tender that dance for joy in summer air, you meadow grasses, bright and slender, you flow'rs so fragrant and so fair, you live to show God's praise alone. Join me to make his glory known"

(ELW #833, vs. 3)!

In the Finale of his Motet for Double Choir, BWV 225, J. S. Bach articulates, in human words and melody, creation's praise to God already ascending to heaven in the sounds of the wren, the fragrance of the lilacs, and the vista of verdant fields and forests.

"All breathing life sing and praise ye, the Lord! Alleluia!"

Yes, creation exists to show God's praise alone, and in her worship the whole Church in the earth and heaven participates in that cosmic liturgy. Neither the wren or the lilac or the fields and forests, nor the Christian, can withhold praise to God for all his works.

"To Father and to Son and Holy Ghost," sang all the heavens, "glory!"---filling me with drunken joy; it seemed what I beheld Was laughter of the universe, the glee of laughter whose inebriating swell enters by what you hear and what you see.

O joy! O happiness ineffable!
O riches safe, no worry of desire!
O life of love and peace, perfect and full!"
--Dante's *The Divine Comedy*

There's nothing better than Christian joy and delight offered melodiously in full throated praise! And you can take that to the bank! plm+

Others present: Lisa Chiglo—Parish Secretary and Pastor Luther.

Devotional prayer was given by Pr Luther.

Agenda was reviewed and updated. Motion by Dick and second by Gordon to approve the corrected agenda. Motion passed.

Members to address the council: None.

President's report was given by Kyle, updates to be reviewed during New Business under the parsonage repairs. There was nothing additional from Dick beyond what was reviewed in the Elstad meeting.

The Pastor's report was given with many updates:

- 1) The Lenten services were successful and well attended. Easter services were also successful. Pr Luther enjoyed his first Easter with us as our pastor.
- 2) Pr Luther continues to meet regularly with our shut in members. They are precious to us.
- 3) Pr Luther also plans to visit the young families of our parish this summer to learn of their interests and concerns. He also looks forward to learning about their relationship with Christ and to nurture their growth.
- 4) Pr Luther is thankful to be here with us. He is thankful for our prayer and continues to pray for us.

There was no correspondence. Each church did receive an opportunity to donate to ELCA World Hunger.

Old Business/Committee Reports:

1) November minutes were reviewed for approval. Jennifer made a motion to approve corrected November Parish minutes, second by Allen, Motion passed.

New Business:

- A) Summer 2018 worship schedule. Shared summer worship has affected both attendance and giving. We discussed adding a trial Wednesday evening summer worship service. This would also alternate between churches. Dates to be determined. Motion by Gordon and second by Dick to add Wednesday evening services to the 2017 Summer worship schedule beginning in June.
- B) Haiti Mission. This is an important mission and something that we as a parish would like to continue. Current activities include further work on the school, VBS, and continuing to feed the children. Money for purchase of goats is also appreciated. Underwear, socks, supplies and monetary donations are also appreciated.
 - We are looking for volunteers to help coordinate this mission. There is a small group going to Haiti in July. There is opportunity for travel to Haiti with a small group in the fall. Due to increased work demands, John and Michelle Rein are no longer able to attend this fall. If any parish members are interested in this opportunity, please reach out to Pr Luther or John and Michelle for additional information.
- C) Brad Boice concert. There is a Brad Boice concert scheduled for August 6 at 2pm at Highland Prairie Bowl. This is a gift to our parish and will be followed by fellowship. This is the same time as the Lanesboro Buffalo Bill parade. Pr Luther will check the time, but encourages attendance.
- D) Parsonage update. There are continued updates and repairs that are needed. There is an area of stucco that needs to be replaced, tuckpointing need to be completed, and the rubber roofing is also in need of repair. There is an upcoming parsonage walk through by the Parsonage committee to prioritize repairs. Thanks to everyone who was involved in the tree clean up.

The Meeting was held at Elstad Lutheran Church with Elstad President Dick Haight calling the meeting to order at 6:40 PM.

Roll call was taken with Jodie Daniels, Karen Bakken, and Gordon Johnson absent. A Quorum was called.

Others present: Lisa Chiglo—Parish Secretary, Pastor Luther, and David Bakke as a parish member to address the council.

Devotions were given by Pastor Luther.

Agenda was approved.

Members to address the council: David Bakke/Bakke Farms – please see Land Rent under new business.

Secretary's report was tabled.

President's report was given. Pastor Luther and members from each congregation will be attending services at Zumbrota Lutheran Church for the installation of the new deacon. The Root River Conference will also be held discussing how to approach challenging situations.

The Pastor's report was given.

- 1. Pastor Luther strives to understand the individuality of each congregation, yet work to build us as a cohesive Parish with communal togetherness. There should be ongoing conversations to continue to foster this growth.
- 2. Ministry to youth and family is also an area of focus. How do we encourage young families? How do we minister to them and support them? This should be an ongoing conversation.

There was no correspondence.

Old Business/Committee Reports:

A) none

New Business:

- A) Copier. The copier was fixed but will need to be replaced. Replacement can be a purchase or lease. Another option would be to utilize a print service and hire out printing. Rita and Sarah will work in a subcommittee to look into options, anticipated costs, benefits and challenges with each alternative. This will be brought back to the council.
- B) Worship Service time. Worship service time was also brought up as a concern. This was raised at an annual meeting and a straw poll was completed. At this time, the concern is noted, but no further action is thought to be required.
- C) Outdoor Worship schedule. Rally Sunday is 9-10-17. This was to be the first Sunday off the summer worship schedule. Since the congregations will be having a Joint Rally Sunday program, motion was made by Michelle, second by Sarah to have Joint Rally Sunday Program at 9:00, Joint service at HP at 10:00. There is also a vintage ball game planned at HP that date.
- D) Haiti Mission. Michelle gave an update regarding the Mission work being done in Haiti. There is a small group planning a trip this summer. Monetary funds would be the best means of support. Currently Pr Mioche and his team are working on completing the restroom facilities, drilling a new well, and planning ongoing projects. After Easter, more deliberate work will be pursued.
- E) Land Rent. There was a concern raised regarding the land rent contract with Bakke Farms. The land contract specifies that corn needs to be grown on this property. This was not initially recognized by Bakke Farms, and they are requesting they be allowed to grow soybeans. It is recognized that this restriction was noted by other bids for the contract, and the ability to grow other crops may have affected bids. The name on the land contract is also incorrect. This was changed from Collin Bakke to Bakke Farms. After discussion, motion by Sarah and second by Kay to adhere to 2017 contract restriction, requiring corn be planted. The motion passed. In order to come to a fair resolution, Bakke Farms will be offered the option to either null the contract after 1 year, or undergo arbitration meetings to come to a satisfactory conclusion for both parties.

June Issue: 2017 Synod Assembly Highlights

We celebrated the 30th annual Southeastern Minnesota Synod Assembly on May 6-7, 2017 at the Mayo Civic Center in Rochester. Voting members from the 174 congregations across the synod came together for the two-day gathering. The event's theme was "Equipping congregations to follow Jesus into a changing world."

Saturday, May 6 highlights:

- The assembly began with worship led by Bishop Steven Delzer, Deacon Kris Oppegard, and Rev. Emily Carson.
- Rev. Gladys Moore shared the keynote presentation.
- Rev. Pete Reuss shared updates about Leading Together. The assembly offering was directed toward raising up 35 new leaders through leading Together. Over \$15,000 was raised, and 301 individuals participated.
- After lunch, attendees participated in a Learning Event featuring ten different workshops to choose from.
- Between the two workshop sessions, everyone gathered in the main assembly hall for a panel discussion entitled "embRACE: The Bishop's Conversation." Regina Seabrook was the panel facilitator. Panelists included Rev. Gladys Moore, Rev. Chad Johnson, Rev. Samuel Wolff, and Carrie Schiltz.
- Saturday concluded with "The Church's Journey in Art and Song" which was a contemplative worship service featuring videos and art from across the centuries.

Sunday, May 7 highlights:

- Sunday morning worship was led by Bishop Steven Delzer, Rev. Grace Gravelle, and Synodically Authorized Minister Simon Choat.
- Rev. Dr. Eric Barreto led a Bible study on the book of Acts.
- Rev. Dr. Stephen Bouman shared a message from churchwide.
- Bishop Delzer shared his annual *Report to the Assembly* highlighting the ways he has witnessed the people of the synod developing leaders, equipping congregations, and accompanying global partners over the past year.
- The 2018 budget was passed.
- Elections took place for a variety of synod committees.
- All four resolutions were passed.

The four resolutions passed at the assembly included:

Resolution 2017-1: Minimum Compensation and Benefits Guidelines

- Resolution 2017-2: From the Blue Earth River Conference Regarding the Use of "Mission Support" in Place of "Benevolence"
- Resolution 2017-3: Support for Palestinians: A Way to a Just Settlement
- Resolution 2017-4: A Proposal to Amend the Model Constitution for Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

Next year's assembly will be held at the Verizon Center in Mankato the first weekend in May. The determination of whether it will be Friday-Saturday or Saturday-Sunday will be based on this year's feedback. The theme of the 2018 assembly will be "Accompanying our Global Partners" and we will have guests from Tanzania, Colombia, and South Sudan!

A special thanks to all who participated in the 2017 Southeastern Minnesota Synod Assembly. Please share these highlights in your context.
