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Pastor's Page March 2022

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

On Sunday, February 27th, the gospel text recounted the event in which Jesus took the chosen three disciples, Peter, James, and John, to the top of Mount Tabor. There, he was transfigured before their eyes, "the appearance of his face was altered," and his clothing became dazzling white (see Luke 9). On impulse, Peter said, "Master, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah..." He didn't know what he was saying. Then a cloud from heaven overshadowed them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. A piercing voice came forth from heaven, saying, "This is my Son, the Chosen One; listen to him!" "And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And (the disciples) kept silent and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen."

Those versed in Sacred Writ have noted the play of light and darkness in this event upon the Mount of Transfiguration. The 3 disciples were overshadowed in a cloud. They were afraid as they entered it. Think about how this event hearkens to the past history of God's people and the early days of mankind. In the creation story in Genesis 1, we read that "darkness was upon the face of the waters. And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. It also draws our minds to a future event, for an instant opening upon another mountain, Mount Calvary, about to come; that day when darkness shall cover the land, and the earth shall tremble, tearing in two the veil of the Temple, and graves open giving forth their dead. What a stunning scene for eyes to behold!

And what other happenings in Scripture bear witness to such darkness experienced by mere mortals only to be shot through with the light of God's own brilliant light? Think of Jesus, whose spit mixed with dirt, was pressed into the eyes of a man whose vision was dark as the mud. And think of what Christ's command to go wash in the pool of Siloam meant to this man living in the darkness of his condition? In the darkness of Christ-formed mud was brilliant light, and a blindman, made a new creation, came forth! Furthermore, consider Christ's dark and agonizing cry from the cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" What darkness, indeed! And yet there Christ, our Savior, is piercing the silence of suffering and death. Out of such darkness he, the bearer of Light, breaks forth in a radiance unimagined for all who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

Yes, Jesus, our Christ, augurs a great transfiguration of our lives and all of our days. To our great surprise, and that of the world's, he operates in a backassward way. He enters into the heart of the thick shadows and darkness of our lives, and that of the world's, and breaks forth in the brilliant and saving radiance of his divine love and mercy. (Mysteriously and wonderfully, even as I write, the great hymns of Christmas and Holy Week have begun to stream through my head announcing this great Truth---"It came upon a midnight clear," "All my heart this night rejoices," "O little town of Bethlehem," "From heav'n above to earth I come," "Christ is risen! Alleluia" "Come, You Faithful, Raise the Strain,"etc.). Get your hymnbook and see how this the transfiguring love of God sings. It did to St. Clement in the following verse that sings, indeed!

Sunset to sunrise changes now,
For God doth make his world anew;
On the Redeemer's thorn-crowned brow
The wonders of that dawn we view.
E'en thought the sun withholds his light,
Lo! A more heavenly lamp shines here,
And form the cross on Calvary's height
Gleams of eternity appear.

>Ash Wednesday, March 2nd, begins our annual journey through the season of Lent. It is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It is also a time to immerse yourself in the daily reading of the Scriptures. (If you need guidance and/or resources for this discipline, please speak with me. plm+) The season ends on Holy Thursday (Maundy). In the midst of practicing these disciplines, we prepare to celebrate the Lord's resurrection at Easter. The color of the season is purple, a penitential color. Ash Wednesday Holy Communion with include "imposition of ashes" for those who desire it.

>During the Wednesday of Lent we will be utilizing Holden Evening Prayer as our order for worship. Pr. Mathsen will be offering a series entitled, "The Marks of the Church." We will be addressing the question: What are the marks by which Christian people are recognized? What do these marks mean? And why are they important? Each Wednesday evening will begin with a soup supper served at 6:00 p.m.

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---an excerpt from a sermon by Roy A. Harrisville entitled "There's Your Sign" (Text: 1 Corinthians 1.22-24)

People were always after him to perform like Houdini. His enemies: "C'mon, Jesus, 'rar up and do a miracle, like Elisha with the floating ax-head!" His disciples: "Lord, give us a peek at God!" His mother: "Now Son, this is a dandy time to climax the festivities. Make with the wine!" Ever since, men have been nagging Jesus for some kind of razzle-dazzle. Indeed, the whole history of Christianity could be written in terms of men's serving up to the world some kind of carnival act in the name of Jesus.....

Now the word to you is that there is no tearing of the veil, no sight of the naked God, but there is a sign---a palpable, concrete, tangible something to which to anchor yourself and from which to take your confidence that God is and that he is true, that is, if you have the eyes. Jesus of Nazareth, a man mighty in word and deed before God and all the people, and put to death at God's design, was raised from the dead to be Lord. In him there is deliverance and freedom. Repent and believe the Gospel, receive the Holy Ghost, call on his name, and take the world captive with your love! There's your sign! And in a moment or two you'll chew a flat-tasting wafer and swallow a bit of wine. There's your sign! And this is all there is---the word of the cross uttered through human lips and a little bit of unleavened bread and port in the gullet. No Shekina in the temple, no seraphim with a burning coal in his hand, no vision of wheel within a wheel. But if this sign is all there is, it is really *all*, everything! For it is God's own flesh, his humanity, his birth and baptism, temptation and hungering, his withdrawal and journey to death, his cross! Wake up and peer behind it to his incarnation and anointing, his exorcism of demons and feeding of the multitude, his transfiguration and exaltation!

You sense, you hear, and taste only the sign, only the humanity---sometimes not even that clearly enough, because of me (your preacher) and some other poor fellow who couldn't leave a wafer alone but had to emboss a creature of his own imagination upon it---you perceive only the sign because he will not bludgeon you into his arms with legerdemain but takes this form so as to win you on your own ground. He wants your freedom! And what a risk he runs! For what if you should spurn the sign and go seeking him in some running brook, or in the eyes of a child, in a cause or even within yourself? What if you should count it too mean and too small and think to discover him in some grandiose worldview? Or what if you should decide that there is no sign of him anywhere since he does not exist? And what a risk *you* run! For to abandon yourself to this sign and to no other, to see deity behind humanity here and only here, you must always be a lover of freedom—first, of God's who in the very moment he is encountered beneath the sign must be acknowledged to be Lord over that sign and never compelled to inhabit it by anything else than his love; then, of your own, rejecting, repudiating every other sign for the sake of this one which demands the free verdict of your heart!
